#69 Home Rule Petition Tax Exemptions for ADU rental properties
Ms Chiancola reviews the language of the Home Rule Petition with the Committee.
Councilor Prosniewski asks if the 70% affordability (Section 4) refers to the Area Median Income, as a Boston suburb. Ms. Chiancola explains that it is based on the Fair Market Rent, which is also regional, and is updated annually. A Studio would rent for no more than \$1219.40, a 1-bedroom for \$1346.80, and a 2-bedroom for \$1635.20. These are the figures for 70% of the Fair Market Rent.
Councilor Prosniewski asks how the tax is calculated if you add an addition to your house. Is it based on the additional square footage with the additional footprint.
Ms Chiancola explains that the addition would be taxed as living space, not as an accessory dwelling unit. The value of the kitchen and bathroom would not be included in the assessment.
Councilor Prosniewski moves to return this Home Rule Petition for Tax Exemptions for ADU Rental Properties to the Council with a positive recommendation for approval, seconded by Councilor Hapworth. Passes 3-0 (2 absent).
On the motion of C. Prosniewski the meeting adjourned at 6:13 P.M.
