FIRST PASSAGE

In the year Two Thousand and Sixteen

An Ordinance to amend an Ordinance relative to air pumps required to store fuel

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Salem, as follows:

Section I. Chapter 14, Sec. 14-44. - *Operative air pump required to store fuel* is hereby amended by deleting this section in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

"Sec. 14-44. - Operative air pump required to store fuel.

- (a) The approval of any license or permit to store fuel for the purposes of retail sale to the public or the approval of any application for the renewal or reissuance of any license or permit to store fuel for the purpose of retail sale to the public shall be conditioned upon the installation and continuing maintenance and operation on the licensed premises of an air pump for the use of the general public free of charge for the purpose of tire inflation during the hours such premises are open for business. Each such licensee shall post a sign in conspicuous location upon the premises and in such form as the Sealer of Weights and Measures may require, informing the public of the availability of an air compressor for free public use during the hours such premises are open.
- (b) It shall be the duty of any licensee, pursuant to this ordinance, to promptly notify the Sealer Weights and Measures in writing in the event of the removal of any sign provided by the Sealer of Weights and Measures and/or the failure of or inoperability of any air pump provided for the general use of the public pursuant to this ordinance.
- (c) Unless the time is extended by the Sealer of Weights and Measures, the failure to keep the air pump operative and available to the general public for more than 72 consecutive business hours shall constitute a violation of the condition of the license or permit and such violation shall be subject to a \$25 per day fine and/or sufficient to result in the revocation of the license or permit."

Section II. This Ordinance shall take effect as provided by City Charter.
