Bluebikes Expansion

The City of Salem has announced the addition of seven new Bluebikes stations, expanding access beyond the eight stations that were originally introduced when Metro Boston's public bikeshare system first entered Salem in 2021. The new stations, including one at Salem State University's North Campus, offer more opportunity for residents, students, workers, and visitors to experience the healthy, fun, and sustainable way of traveling via Bluebikes.

"Expanding access to Bluebikes in Salem helps further connect our city and make more neighborhoods and destinations reachable by bike," said Mayor Driscoll. "With fifteen total stations now located throughout Salem, our residents, students, workers, and visitors have more access to this healthy, fun, and sustainable way of traveling – while also reducing our city's reliance on passenger vehicles and their associated climate and congestion impacts. The launch of Bluebikes in 2021 was a huge success, thanks to Blue Cross, Salem State University and our local program partners, all of whom made it an easy and seamless process to expand the number of stations in our city."

The expansion of Bluebikes was made possible by a combination of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and other city funding and support from Blue Cross and Salem State University. With seven new stations, approximately 44 new bikes have been added throughout the city. The new stations are at the locations listed below:

- Salem State University North Campus
- Essex St at Dalton Parkway
- Forest River Park
- Salem MBTA Lower Level
- Community Life Center
- Goodhue St at Grove St
- North St at Liberty Hill Ave

Riders can purchase annual Bluebikes memberships – which include unlimited 45-minute rides—for \$119 a year or \$26.75 for 30 days. A discount program, where annual passes are \$50 and 30-day passes are available for \$5, is available for residents with eligible incomes. For more information on Bluebikes visit www.bluebikes.com.

COVID Testing

The City of Salem has additional free rapid antigen COVID-19 tests available for athome use. Any Salem resident or individual who works in Salem is eligible to pick up three boxes of tests (two tests per box) from the Health Department offices, 98 Washington Street 3rd floor, Mondays-Wednesdays 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. and Thursdays 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. as long as supplies last.



The Curative COVID-19 testing site in Riley Plaza now offers real time rapid PCR testing (self-pay, \$135); sign up online at www.curative.com. Real time rapid PCR is only available from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Mondays to Fridays and Saturdays from 9:00 to noon. Unlike with regular PCR testing, in which results are returned within 24-48 hours, rapid PCR results are generated immediately. These tests are useful when the higher sensitivity of a PCR test is necessary, but you need your results sooner than 24-48 hours.

E-Waste Collection

Salem residents & property owners (with ID or tax bill) can recycle e-waste on the last Saturday of the quarter at Salem High School. Please stay in your vehicle the whole time and have your items ready to unload in your trunk, truck bed or hatchback – items will not be unloaded from car seats. Please have your cash or check (payable to RMG Enterprise) ready. Recycling anything with a plug: \$20 for each TV or monitor, each Freon appliance (fridge, AC, freezer, dehumidifier), and each piece of exercise equipment (treadmills, bikes, ellipticals etc.). All other electronics FREE: computer tower, laptop, tablet, cell phone, small appliances, household electronics, printer, fax, VCR, CD player, etc.

Please NO commercial drop offs or white goods (including washers, dryers, stoves). Call Waste Management at 800-972-4545 to schedule a free white good curbside pick-up. E-items containing mercury, along with CFL bulbs, can be brought to Salem DPS, 5 Jefferson Ave., during City business hours. For more info, call 978-619-5672.

Affordable Housing Lottery



The lottery is now open for The Lighthouses, the North Shore Community Development Coalition's (NSCDC) newest affordable housing development in the Point neighborhood in Salem. The Lighthouses consist of two buildings containing 46 affordable homes, including studio, one-, two-, and three-bedroom apartments. These apartments are for residents who earn below 30% and 60% of the area median income.

Lighthouse 47, located on the corner of Leavitt Street and Congress Street, will be home to 25 affordable apartments for families, as well as The Salem Pantry's first storefront location, which has been made possible thanks to funding from the City of Salem's federal American Rescue Plan Act allocation. Lighthouse 34, located on Peabody Street, will create a pathway access between Ward Street and Peabody Street, contain a gallery, and consist of 21 affordable homes. The Lighthouses is NSCDC's second Passive House development and their first in Salem.

The project is made possible with funding from a City of Salem Community Preservation Act grant and the City's federal HOMES funding allocation. For more information about the Lighthouses and to apply for the lottery for a unit, please visit www.livethelighthouses.com.
