Aspire Developmental Services, Inc. Hosted December, 2019 Meeting

The December, 2019 Salem HOPE meeting was hosted by Aspire Developmental Services, Inc. Representing the agency was Kristen Evans. Present were Jane Guy and Naomi Francisco of the City of Salem DPCD, Laurie Fullerton of the Brookhouse Home, Maureen Fiore and Dee Cobin of Citizens, Inn, Wanda Carmona, Devin DeVasto, Stephanie Jackson and Elizabeth Ospina of MA Rehabilitation Commission, Miriam Martinez and

Yevette Garcia of North Shore CDC, Camilla Blackman of Wellspring House, Trish Kennedy of Catholic Charities, Joyce Arcisz of Goodwill, Debra Wonson of CFCE of the North Shore, Sage Shaw of Open Door Immigration Services, Rachael Walker of For Kids Only After School and Maureen Pasek-Tourville of Salem Public Schools.

Ms. Evans, Developmental Specialist, welcomed the group and stated that Aspire has sites in Salem and Lynn, serving ages birth to three years old. They are a home visiting program that works with the family. Services are covered by insurance or the Department of Public Health. They provide toddler groups, as well as parent-child groups. Parent-Child groups are also located at the Danvers and Marblehead YMCAs and at Citizens, Inn. At 2 1/2, children transition to public school. She stated that anyone can make a referral (parent, teacher, daycare, DCF, pediatrician, etc.)

Ms. DeVasto stated that she is a counsellor at MA Rehabilitation Commission and that they have increased their job placement staff. They are starting to run job groups and are looking to make local connections.

Ms. Jackson of MA Rehab stated that there is a new initiative called Empower to Employment, a one-year program that provides help with short term training.

Ms. Ospina stated that she is a Vocation Rehabilitation Counsellor with MA Rehab and that the Empower to Employment program gets people ready for employment and offers transportation stipends and child care vouchers.

Ms. Carmona stated that she is an Employment Specialist with MA Rehab, providing job placement assistance. She helps people looking for work and helps them keep their jobs and be self-sufficient. She stated that if employers have a job, she will help fill it.

Ms. Arcisz stated that she is a Case Manager at <u>Goodwill Industries</u>. They have a dayhab program and a employment program. The agency acquired Pioneer Valley in Springfield. They always are looking for referrals.

Ms. Blackman stated that the <u>Wellspring House</u>'s MediClerk training program is growing. The recently graduated 10 and have 16 in the next session. It is a 15-week program for entry level administrative positions in the medical field. Their placement rate is 87%.

Ms. Fullerton stated that she is the Director of Community Relations at the <u>Brookhouse Home</u>, a rest home. She stated that they would love to collaborate more and the people are welcome to stop by any time. They currently have kitchen and housekeeping jobs posted.

Ms. Pasek-Tourville stated that she is from the Parent-Child Plus program at Salem Public Schools. It is a free program that provides home visiting bringing literacy and resources to parents. It is a 2 year program in English and Spanish.

Ms. Walker stated that she is a Regional Social Worker for For Kids Only After School, in Salem, Peabody, Chelsea, Winthrop and Everett.

Ms. Fiore stated that <u>Citizens Inn</u> is a shelter program for families. They have a sober living transitional shelter and a room for families not eligible for DTA. They run the Haven From Hunger food pantry and provide dinners four nights per week. They also have a mobile food market every other week.

Ms. Cobin stated that she is the new Substance Abuse Case Manager at Citizens Inn.

Ms. Shaw stated that she is the Executive Director for <u>Open Door Immigration</u> which provides immigration legal services, such as helping to file paperwork. They offer free citizenship classes for Salem residents and offer know your rights training.

Ms. Kennedy stated that she is a Program Manager at <u>Catholic Charities</u> for English language learners programs in Lynn and Salem. They are in need of volunteers to teach 1 ½ hour classes each week.

Ms. Wonson stated that the <u>CFCE of the North Shore</u> serves 9 communities with free services, including play groups, resources and referrals, and stem activity programs at Salem Sound Coastwatch. She also works with Peabody's Parent Child Plus.

Ms. Garcia stated that she is the Director of Community Engagement at <u>North Shore CDC</u> which provides affordable housing on the North Shore. The provide services, run Espacio community space, collaborate with the mobile food market every two weeks, provide Youthbuild, have an upcoming first time homebuyer course and are launching a small business initiative.

Ms. Martinez stated that she is the Family Stability Coordinator at North Shore CDC and works to help people find a job, apply for housing, provide translation and assist with health insurance.

Ms. Francisco stated that she is the City of Salem's Housing Coordinator, administering the Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program to bring properties up to code. She also administers the First Time Homebuyer

Program which provides up to \$7500 for downpayment/closing costs. The City of Salem is also a service agency for the Get the Lead Out Program.

Ms. Guy stated that she is the Assistant Community Development Director for the City of Salem <u>Department of</u> <u>Planning and Community Development</u>, and that Request for Proposals for the next round of CDBG public service funding will be sent out in January.

Aspire

About Aspire

65 Years of serving children and families

The mission of Aspire – as it has been since 1974 -- is to positively affect the quality of life of people with disabilities and their families. Aspire strives to: enable individuals with severe disabilities to attain the fullest possible employment, productivity and participation in an integrated community; improve living conditions in all circumstances; involve persons with severe disabilities in decision-making processes affecting their lives; and mobilize human and financial resources to fulfill the mission.

Aspire's primary focus is to provide Early Intervention services to children up to age 3. Children who are served are considered at risk for a variety of issues including Down syndrome, autism, hearing and vision loss, speech and motor delays and mental health. The agency has a multi-disciplinary team that includes Early Intervention specialists, occupational, physical and speech therapists, and social workers. Every child served has an individual family service plan (IFSP), which is similar to the individualized education plan (IEP) used by school districts once the child enters at age 3.

Aspire also has an Early Support Program (EIPP), one of only eight in the state. The goal of that program is to reduce infant mortality by identifying risks to parents and babies, often before the babies are born. In 2014-15, approximately 11% of children served by Aspire (as compared to 2.4% statewide) came through this program. The agency also runs the Aspire Early Education Center, a pre-school that is open to typically developing children and those with mild developmental delays.
