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March Meeting Hosted by North Shore Community Development Coalition

The March, 2017 Salem HOPE meeting was hosted by the [North Shore Community Development Coalition](#). Representing the agency were Rosario Ubiera-Minaya, Beth Alaimo and Keshia De Leon. Present were Jane Guy and Naomi Francisco of the City of Salem DPCD; Carol Hawthorne of Anchor to Windward, Richard Jache and Joe DiVincenzo of Triangle, Inc., Bernadette Orr of North Shore Community Health Coalition, Ann-Marie O’Keefe of the North Shore Youth Career Center, Maureen Fiore of Aspire Developmental Services, Inc; Debra Wonson of Salem

CFCE, Katina Polemenako of Salvation Army, Deborah Barber of the Independent Living Center of the North Shore and Cape Ann, Inc. (ILCNSCA), Yari Acevedo and Linda LaSpada of NSCAP, Christin Brown and Carl Wilson of Children’s Friend & Family, Stephanie Jackson of Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission (MRC), Anne-Marie D’Angelo-Florent of MassHealth and Phil Hayes of Bass River, Inc.

Ms. Ubiera-Minaya welcomed the group to North Shore CDC’s new office space and noted that local artists provided the art. She stated that NSCDC has been in the Point Neighborhood for approximately 30 years, when it started as Salem Harbor Community Development Corporation. Through a merger, they became a regional agency whose mission is to invest in neighborhoods to create thriving communities. NSCDC invests in real estate and develops or rehabilitates housing. Their new 77 unit rehabilitation project will have a community space that will be open this summer and they are currently doing a crowd funding campaign in support of interior amenities. They also have housing in Beverly and will be developing units in Gloucester and Merrimac. She stated that the agency works with residents toward community engagement and they provide a family resource center that offers ESL, financial stability programs and workshops, including homeownership workshops. They are in the process of redeveloping a building on Harbor Street that will have 15 units of housing for homeless youth.

Ms. Hawthorne stated that [Anchor To Windward](#) is a private non-profit that serves adults with mild intellectual disabilities by providing a comfortable place to socialize, including bowling and other activities.

Mr. Jache stated that he is the Site Manager at [Triangle, Inc.](#), which serves adults with disabilities. Their focus is a day program to get clients out into the community and working . The provide assessments and work on job skills

Mr. DiVincenzo stated that he is an Employment Specialist at Triangle, Inc. and they are looking for opportunities for volunteering and jobs, in general.

Ms. Thomas stated that [New Liberty Innovation School](#) is a competency based school where students are assessed by skill level for ages 14-22 for those where traditional high school does not work.

Ms. Polemenako stated that the [Salvation Army](#) provides emergency services, a food pantry, Camp Wonderland (a one week camp for ages 6-12) and a Good Neighbor Fund for those over-income for fuel assistance.

Ms. Orr stated that she is the new Director of [North Shore Community Health Network](#). They are opening a grant round on March 29th with a focus on youth and adolescent behavioral health and elderly care. Grants are typically \$10-20,000.

Ms. Fiore stated that [Aspire Developmental Services](#)' main program is early intervention for ages 0-3. They have parent/child play groups, toddler groups, an early support program for expectant moms, an adult program for job placement and a child care center. They will be opening a new building in Lynn.

Ms. Wonson stated that she is the Grant Coordinator for [Coordinated Family and Community Engagement](#), a grant funded program in Salem Public Schools to offer resources and referrals to parents. They offer parent/child play groups, ELL family groups and workshops. All services are free.

Yari Acevedo stated that [NSCAP](#) provides ESOL and works with homeless families for the Housing Pathways Program.

Ms. LaSpada stated that NSCAP has funds for rental start-up, rent and utility arrearages, fuel assistance (for those at or below 60% of median income), weatherization and home car.

Ms. Alaimo stated that North Shore CDC will be having its Youth Get To The Point Day in April. They will also be having a summer STAND Program, which is an employment program for youth 14-16.

Ms. DeLeon stated that North Shore CDC has YouthBuild Program for ages 16-24 that need an opportunity to learn skills and to earn their GED or high school equivalency.

Mr. Hayes stated that [Bass River](#) is a day program for adults with disabilities. They have a new building on Bridge Street in Salem that has a certified commercial kitchen that can be rented out to vendors.

Ms. D'Angelo-Florent stated that she is a member education rep for [MassHealth](#), providing education on enrollment and eligibility. She stated that the new income guidelines are available and that there are new revised paper applications.

Ms. Barber stated that [ILCNSCA](#) helps anyone with any disability to get resources to live independently. They have a workshop on affordable/accessible/available housing on March 21st and are celebrating their 30th anniversary on April 27th.

Mr. Wilson stated that [Children's Friend & Family Services](#) was awarded a North Shore Medical Center grant to help fill voids in the mental health system in terms of insurance.

Ms. Brown stated that Children's Friend and Family is located on Boston Street in Salem and provides outpatient therapy, inpatient therapy and therapeutic mentoring. They are doing a positive parenting program.

Ms. Jackson stated [MRC](#) helps individuals with disabilities become employed. They provide training, assessments, home or vehicle modifications and transportation. They have a prep program for soft skills.

Ms. O'Keefe stated that the [North Shore Youth Career Center](#) helps youth 14-24 to get jobs. The office is located in Lynn. They provide readiness workshops at schools, have a First Jobs Program with applications due in April for employers and youth. They have a Future of Work grant to do a survey to assess needs.

Coming Soon – Espacio! The Point Neighborhood Community Space

In 2017, North Shore CDC will construct a dynamic, new 2,000+ square foot programming space within a newly-renovated affordable housing development on Congress Street in The Point neighborhood in Salem. This new program space is an opportunity to create strategic programming around basic needs and services, and business, educational, and recreational activities. The programming to be offered will be free of charge and will include the following:

- public work and meeting space
- dance, art, fitness and sewing classes;
- healthy and budget cooking classes;
- reading clubs and a Dominos club;
- job search assistance;
- ESL classes;
- health insurance application assistance;
- naturalization classes and legal services;
- first time home ownership workshops;
- tax preparation assistance.

Ms. Francisco stated that she is the City's Housing Coordinator and administers the [housing programs](#), such as First Time Homebuyer Program for downpayment assistance and the Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program to undertake emergency assistance or to bring properties up to code. The City is also the locale agency for the State's Get the Lead Out Program.

Ms. Guy stated that the CDBG Action Plan process is underway and that www.salem.com should be watched for the availability of the draft plan and notice of public hearing. Mr. Guy distributed [Imagine Salem](#) information, which is a community conversation about the vision for Salem's future. She asked attendees to complete the question cards and/or take the on-line survey. Imagine Salem drop off boxes for cards are located at City Hall, DPCD, Council on Aging, Salem Public Library, and the Salem Chamber of Commerce.

Position Title: Citizenship Coordinator

Location: North Shore Community Action Programs, Peabody, MA

The NAIP Citizenship Coordinator will work closely with MIRA and NSCAP staff to provide free N-400 application assistance and citizenship classes to eligible LPRs interested in applying for US citizenship. The member will achieve this by coordinating the logistics of MIRA's in-house and travelling citizenship workshops throughout the year, teaching 2-3 cycles of ESOL/citizenship classes, organizing outreach and by conducting daily pre-screening and follow-up to clients about their citizenship applications. The member will also provide referral services, develop curriculum and manage citizenship volunteers, as needed.
