# North Shore Community College Adult Learning Center Hosted Winter Meeting

The December, 2009 Salem HOPE meeting was hosted by North Shore Community College's <u>Adult Learning Center</u>. Representing the agency was Coordinator Sonya Snow Parrish. Present were Jane Guy of the City of Salem DPCD, Kathy O'Brien of the Independent Living Center, Bruce Menin and Laura Koumarianos of

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the Family Self-Sufficiency Center, Roz Hurwitz and Gail Kelley of Goodwill Industries, Teury Marte of MassRehab, Barbara Reeder of NSCAP, Kathy Adams of Inn Between, Sandy Sabo and Linda Beaver of Wellspring House, Bill Foley and Kathy Perrella of North Shore Elder Services, Katie Fleet and Amanda Richard of the Children's Law Center, Adria Leach of Salem State College and Jen Davis of North Shore Youth Career Center.

Sonya Snow Parrish welcomed the group and stated that the Adult Learning Center (ALC) offers free GED three days per week from 9:00am to noon, as well as a nighttime fast track class twice a week. The ALC has been at the Cummings Center in Beverly for five years and typically has 70 to 80 students at a time, age 16 to 50s. The program is free and there is a waiting list of up to six months. This adult education program includes GED and pre-GED. Participants get a North Shore Community College student id and have student privileges (i.e. tutoring). Participants sign a contract and must maintain an 80% attendance rate.

Bruce Menin stated that the <u>Family Self-Sufficiency Center</u> has been around for 15 years. They identify gaps in services and get families the services they need to make them self-sufficient. Programs include ESL, GED program with Catholic Charities, work readiness, conflict resolution, problem solving, financial literacy and consumer literacy.

Sandy Sabo stated that she works in the education department of the <u>Wellspring House</u>. They offer a MediClerk Training Program which provides education in the office setting of the medical profession. Wellspring House also offers a GED program in Gloucester and an ESOL program.

Roz Hurwitz stated that she is a Job Specialist with <u>Morgan Memorial Goodwill Industries</u>. All clients have a disability. The agency provides job readiness, assessment and placement, along with a dayhab program of simulated work. The agency undertakes contract work such as mailings.

Gail Kelley stated that she is a new Job Specialist with Morgan Memorial Goodwill Industries.

Adria Leach stated that she works for Salem State College's <u>Center for Civic Engagement</u>. They are looking for community partners.

Kathy O'Brien stated that the Independent Living Center is run by and for people with disabilities. They offer free services for persons of any age. They recently completed a <u>yellow pages</u> of resources.

Kathy Adams stated that the Inn Between has added 5 scattered sites in Salem.

Teury Marte stated that she is a Rehabilitation Councillor with <u>Massachusetts Rehabilitation</u> <u>Commission</u>, which works with persons with disabilities, whether psychiatric, emotional, behavioral or physical. They provide vocation services. She noted that if an individual qualifies for a tuition letter, they do not have to pay for any public school in Massachusetts.

Kathy Perrella stated that North Shore Elder Services has a Family Caregiver Support Program with support groups and has a Benefits Checkup Program.

Bill Foley stated that he is a Commonwealth Care Volunteer with North Shore Elder Services.

Katie Fleet stated that she is an AmeriCorps Vista with the Children's Law Center.

Amanda Richard stated that at the <u>Children's Law Center</u>, lawyers provide direct representation to children in the greater Essex area. There is a free in-state hotline for free information and resources. The offer free trainings on children's law to groups.

Barbara Reeder stated that <u>NSCAP</u> offers ESOL classes for students transitioning to higher education. They partner with Training Resources of American and NSCC's Adult Learning Center. They have waiting lists for all 3 levels. They offer tutoring to help students get into level 1. There are 12-14 students per class. They also have citizenship classes for existing students and a Next Steps class.

Jane Guy of the <u>City of Salem</u> Department of Planning & Community Development reminded the group to forward event notices, job openings, etc. to her and she will either forward them on to the Salem HOPE email distribution list or include it in an upcoming newsletter. She stated that as part of the development of the 5 year Consolidated Plan, the City provided 10 public presentations, including a public hearing and expects the draft plan to be available to the public in March.

## **NSCC Adult Learning Center Program**

FREE basic literacy and GED prep courses to help you pursue further education and job training.

The Adult Learning Center offers students three levels of classes, from basic literacy through GED preparation. Professional instructors, assisted by experienced volunteers, teach the small-sized classes. Students progress at their own pace.



Where & when are the classes held?

The Adult Learning Center at North Shore Community College is located at the <u>Cummings Center</u> in Beverly, MA. Classes meet three mornings a week from September to June. A Fast-Track GED class is also offered two evenings per week.

How can I enroll?

Anyone who has not completed high school, is at least 16 years old, and is not currently in school can enroll.

- 1. Call (978) 236-1227 to schedule an appointment with a program counselor.
- 2. Take an assessment test.
- 3. Add your name to the wait list for the class that will fit your needs.

What skills are taught in our classes?

- Oral Communication English language skills
- Reading Vocabulary skills to reading comprehension
- Writing Grammar, punctuation and essay/report writing
- Math Basic arithmetic to algebra and geometry
- **GED Preparation** Preparation for each of the five areas in the GED test: math, literature, science, social studies and writing
