HEALING ABUSE WORKING FOR CHANGE

HAWC (Healing Abuse Working for Change, formerly known as Help for Abused Women and their Children) is the oldest and the most comprehensive domestic violence agency on the Massachusetts' North Shore. HAWC's direct services are provided in 23 cities and towns throughout the North Shore. The main office is in Salem, with satellite offices in Lynn, Gloucester and Ipswich. Advocates are also outstationed at North Shore Medical Center's Salem and Lynn campuses and the Beverly police department. Over 200 volunteers provide hotline support, court advocacy and support group facilitation.

Hospital Project: Crossroads

Partnering Against Domestic Violence North Shore Medical Center and HAWC

A collaboration of the North Shore Medical Center and HAWC, Crossroads is designed to provide access to services for patients and employees experiencing domestic violence. Crossroads services are free, voluntary and confidential. Crossroads is staffed by two full-time Advocates who provide crisis intervention to patients and staff, as well as training throughout North Shore Medical Center (NSMC). Advocates are hospital-based. If a patient wants to talk with an advocate they can do so at a NSMC site or meet an advocate after being discharged. Hospital advocacy is a critical opportunity for intervention for many of our patients. An individual who might not identify as battered may respond more openly to questions about his/her safety posed by health care providers.

LGBT Elders in a Changing World: An Interdisciplinary Conference

This conference is being held on Friday, March 16, 2012 at Salem State University and is sponsored by The LGBT Aging Project, North Shore Elder Services, and Salem State University's School of Social Work. This conference is the first day-long event in New England focusing on issues of older persons who are lesbian, gay, bi-sexual, or transgender and is expected to draw over two hundred social service and health care professionals, students and elders themselves, all interested in the subject of LGBT aging and caregiving.

The plenary session features Judith B. Bradford, Ph.D. Director of the Center for Population Research in LGBT Health at The Fenway Institute in Boston. Highlighted presenters include Charles Emlet, Ph.D., University of Washington, Co-Principal Investigator on *Caring and Aging with Pride*, the first national project to study health and wellness among lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender elders and their caregivers, and Sean Cahill, author of the pioneering work on LGBT policy, *Outing Age*. Fifteen workshops will cover areas including public policy, transgender aging, practice skills, HIV and aging, and end of life and bereavement. The acclaimed documentary film, *Gen Silent*, will be screened followed by a moderated discussion which will include film director, Stu Maddux, and three of the elders featured in the film.

"It is exciting to see this ground-breaking conference being held at Salem State University" noted Cheryl Springer, Director of the School of Social Work at Salem State University. "I know that social work and health care professionals as well as students will gain from a truly interdisciplinary learning experience that sheds light on the challenges facing LGBT elders and highlights the caring capacity of the LGBT community."

"The Elder LGBT Conference is a unique event bringing together human service workers, as well as LGBT elders themselves, with academic experts who have researched the issues of LGBT older adults and caregivers," explained Paul Lanzikos, Executive Director of Danvers-based North Shore Elder Services. "Our participation is a direct result of our work over the past three years with The LGBT Aging Project in Boston involving outreach and programming for LGBT seniors and caregivers on the North Shore.

"We are thrilled to partner with North Shore Elder Services and Salem State University to present such a comprehensive view of so many aspects of growing older in the LGBT community" stated Lisa Krinsky, Director of The LGBT Aging Project. "We hope this is the first of many such convenings that increase both knowledge about and resources for LGBT older adults and caregivers."

The organizers are dedicated to presentations that integrate content pertinent to cultural competency, disabilities and creative programming, as well as direct and interdisciplinary practice with LGBT elders.
