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Salvation Army Hosted June Meeting

The June, 2013 Salem HOPE meeting was hosted by the <u>Salvation Army</u>. Representing the agency were Captains Scott and Nora McNeil and Katina Polemenako. Present were Jane Guy of the City of Salem DPCD, Anne Marie D'Angelo Florent of MassHealth, Barbara St. Pierre of N.S. Infant & Toddler Program, Marilyn Dean of MA Rehab Commission, Deric LePard of NSCAP, Luz Garay of N. S. Community Development Coalition, Grant Murphy of the Independent Living Center and VeAnn Campbell of North Shore Moving Market.

Captains Scott and Nora McNeil welcomed the group and stated that people think of the Salvation Army as bell and a red kettle at Christmastime. It was started by opening a church for those that were unwanted in other churches. It offered soup, soap and salvation. They have been in Salem since 1884. They have a food pantry from 9 to 11am on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. They provide intake for those needing assistance, such as rental assistance, as well as counseling. On Tuesday and Thursday there is hot lunch for anyone in the community, with no information taken.

Ms. Polermenako stated that the Salvation Army offers a Bridging the Gap program, a 12 week lifeskills course mostly for first time offenders going through the juvenile justice system. If completed, the offender has no record unless they re-offend. She noted that only 3 out of 125 have re-offended after one year. It has produced 7 college students. The program is by referral for ages 12-17.

The Salvation Army offers programs for young people, such as the Sunbeans, and offers tea parties during the year, as well as a fall fellowship party and polar express party. They send 45 young people to a five day camp in Sharon, MA, which is fully certified. The cost depends on the family's ability to pay. Salvation Army stores are attached to rehabilitation centers. They have a 93% success rate for those who complete the program. Most of the Salavation Army youth programs are for ages 6-17, but they will take 5 year olds, if the parents participate.

Ms. Campbell stated that the Salvation Army was her rescue and that she worked in their food pantry and was a Sunbeam. She attributes the Salvation Army in her role in distributing food to people.

Ms. D'Angelo Florent stated that she is a member representative of <u>MassHealth</u> for those who need help with MassHealth clients. She will go out to social service agencies, hospitals and health centers to help people navigate the system. She stated that <u>MassHealth Connector</u> is available for people to purchase health insurance for those who are over-income.

Ms. Dean stated that she provides job placement for <u>Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission</u>. They provide training for people with disabilities of all kinds. She stated the she believed the employment situation is getting better and that wages are getting a little highter. They are looking for job openings for their clients.

Mr. Grant stated that the <u>Independent Living Center</u> has monthly social and recreational events. They will also help people fill out universal housing applications.

Ms. St. Pierre stated that she directs the <u>North Shore Infant and Toddler Program</u>, an early intervention program for birth to 3 months. She stated that anyone can make a referral and there is no cost to the family. They run toddler groups, as well as parent-child groups that are open to community kids who aren't enrolled in early intervention.

Ms. Garay stated that the <u>North Shore Community Development Coalition</u>'s Kristen Anderson is on a journey from Maine to California and that she can be tracked through <u>www.bikeandbuild.org.</u>

Ms. Campbell stated that North Shore Moving Market delivers food to elderly, homebound, disabled and some disadvantaged families. She noted that St. Joseph's Food Pantry has moved to Joseph's Storehouse at East Gate Christian Fellowship.

Mr. LePard stated that North Shore Community Action Programs, Inc. anticipates moving within the next six months. They will most likely be moving to Foster Street. It is an opportunity to bring the three sites together in one location. He noted that they run a home care department, a weatherization program and provide funds for rental and utility arrearages and rental start-up costs.

Ms. Guy stated the <u>City of Salem</u> will be administering the Community Preservation Act, which will provide funds for community housing, historic resources and open space and recreation projects.

SNAP (Food Stamps) is at your local Farmers Market!



When you arrive at the market, find the Manager's or Information Booth. (If you have trouble locating the booth, just ask a vendor to point you in the right direction.) Tell the person at the Information Booth you would like to use your EBT card at the market and let them know how much you want to spend. The teller should be able to help you from there.

Additionally, a double value program allows SNAP

participants to receive a **one for one match** for every dollar that they spend at a farmers' market, (limits may apply). This means that if you decide to spend \$10 at a participating farmers' market you will receive a bonus \$10. Over 20 farmers' markets in Massachusetts are now part of the double value program.
