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# **September Meeting Hosted by Enterprise Center**

The September, 2013 Salem HOPE meeting was hosted by <a href="https://example.com/html">The Enterprise Center</a> at Salem State University. Representing the agency was Laura Swanson. Present were Jane Guy of the City of Salem DPCD, Adria Leach of Salem State University, Charlene Snow of the North Shore Career Center, Raquel Diaz of Salem Public Schools, Liane Davis of Anchor to Windward, Corey Jackson of Citizens for Adequate Housing, Luz Garay of North Shore Community Development Coalition, Leonette Strout of the Salem YMCA, Ana Nuncio of the House of the Seven Gables, Jill Bowen of Catholic Charities, Marilyn Dean of MA Rehab Commission, and Grant Murphy of the Independent Living Center.

Ms. Swanson stated that The Enterprise Center is a non-profit, regional, small business growth center in a 53,000 s.f. building providing start-up to exit. They offer 70 programs per year, with most being free. Programs include social media, cash flow, sales and marketing. They have specialized workshops for non-profit agencies. The also offer live streaming workshops. Those interested can sign up for the website newsletter. Ms. Swanson stated that if a program desired is not currently offered, they will put together a program. There are monthly CEO groups. There is an annual business plan competition for for-profits. The agency started Young Entrepreneurs of the North Shore (YENS), which has now spun off into its own organization.

Ms. Dean stated that she is a job placement specialist for Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission. They provide training for people with disabilities. She stated that they work to help clients, high school age plus, to get the jobs they want that are within their abilities. She asked that she be contacted if agencies have hiring needs.



Ms. Bowen stated that <u>Catholic Charities</u> has offices in Salem, Lynn and Gloucester. They have an initial response program, as funds permit. Funds are for back rent, first month's rent and utilities. They have a Young Parent Program and a Father's Program.

Ms. Nuncio stated that she is the Manager of Community Partnerships with the <u>House of the Seven Gables</u>. They issue Requests for Proposals every two years, with the next being September, 2014, to provide grants to organizations that are in line with their social service mission. The Gables has educational partnerships, including after school enrichment programs with Salem Public Schools and a partnership with the Plummer Home.

Ms. Strout stated that at the <u>Salem YMCA</u>, she works mostly in the Teen Program, including after school programs for girls at the schools and at the Y. They have a financial assistance program so that no one is turned away. They offer child care, Camp Naumkeag day camp and SayMedia, a teen media project. Jason Silva is the new Executive Director.

Ms. Garay stated that the <u>North Shore Community Development Coalition</u>'s goal is to build stronger communities by encouraging people to become active. They provide affordable housing and homebuyer programs.

Corey Jackson, the new Executive Director of <u>Citizens for Adequate Housing</u>, stated that they offer family sheltering in Peabody and Salem for mostly young mothers and their children. They have a sober living program in Peabody and also provide low rent housing.

Mr. Grant stated that the <u>Independent Living Center</u> helps anyone at any age with any disability to live independently. The first Wednesday of each month, they have a housing workshop to help people apply for programs. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, there is an anger management discussion group provided through Northeast Recovery.

Ms. Davis stated that <u>Anchor to Windward</u> is coming up on its 25 year anniversary. They support adults with intellectual disabilities, who are 18+ and are mostly high functioning. They are wholey private, funded by donations and small fees. They help clients live independently and function in the community. They have a social club and events.

Ms. Diaz stated that she is the new Program Specialist for the Coordinated Family and Community Engagement Program at Salem Public Schools. They provide a <u>Parent-Child Home Program</u>.

Ms. Snow stated that the <u>North Shore Career Center</u> is overwhelmed with employers who are hiring. She noted that the 40 stores in the new Marketstreet Lynnfield are recruiting. She noted that they are not near public transportation.

Ms. Leach stated the she is the Director of External Affairs for <u>Salem State University</u> and that the SSU is a resource for non-profits. They have the traditional (volunteers, service learning classes), as well as creative partnerships (social work, nursing). She stated that they can be a very creative resource, noting that Lifebridge's rebranding and marketing was done with SSU students.

Ms. Guy stated the <u>City of Salem</u> is accepting public comment on its <u>Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report</u> until September 25, 2013.
