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### Salem YMCA hosted December meeting

The December, 2014 Salem HOPE meeting was hosted by the Salem YMCA. Representing the agency was Jason Silva and Leonette Strout. Present were Jane Guy of the City of Salem DPCD, Grant Murphy of Independent Living Center of the North Shore and Cape Ann, Inc., Phil Hayes of Journeys of Hope, Jacob Lefker of North Shore CDC, Carol Hawthorne of Anchor to Windward, Jeannette Coleman and Debra Wonson of Children's Friend and Family Services, Jen Orlando of Family Continuity, Maureen Smith, Keyana Brown and Rosa Corzo of NSCAP, Anne-Marie D'Angelo of MassHealth, Ana Laguarda of New Liberty Charter/Salem Community Charter, Michael Pavetto of Bass River, Lianna Sours of Seven Hills and Charlene Snow of the North Shore Career Center.

Mr. Silva welcomed the group and stated that the Salem YMCA is part of the North Shore YMCA of seven branches. They are membership driven with 4500 members. He stated that when

people think about the Y, they think about pools and fitness. He stated that they also provide child care for 200 in after school programs at the Sewall Street location and at the Bentley, Carlton and Bowditch Schools as well as a pre-school program for 60 children. They also have a summer camp at Camp Naumkeag and offer basketball and volleyball. He stated that he has been with the Y for two years and that it is finding its niche, including the arts. They are home to a creative arts center with four to five performances a year, which has sparked new art programming including a free drop in music study program and a media arts center to produce, edit and shoot videos. The Y's strategic goals include increasing academic rigor, working with teens and working with that aging population. For teens, they have two drop in centers with music classes, guitar, piano and percussion and a childhood obesity program in partnership with North Shore Medical Center. They are providing fitness classes at the Salem Council on Aging.

Ms. Strout stated that the YMCA also offers programs for girls at two sites.

Mr. Pavetto stated that he is new to <u>Bass River</u>, providing job development for adults with disabilities. They are looking for new job opportunities.

Mr. Lefker stated that he was recently hired as the Community Engagement Coordinator at North Shore CDC, a community housing and development organization. He is also part of the Everyone Salem social networking campaign to promote inclusivity, with different events each month.

Ms. Wonson stated that Salem <u>Children's Friend and Family Services</u> has a Coordinated Family & Community Engagement Program. She is also the grant coordinator at Salem Public Schools. She is looking to collaborate to help welcome families to services.

Ms. Coleman stated that Children's Friend and Family Services received a grant for an early childhood initiative to train clinicians that will be working with children zero to five, in order to work toward the prevention of abuse and neglect.

Ms. Laguarda stated that she is an adjustment councillor at <u>Salem Community Charter School</u>, an alternative public school that services youth in crisis. They help students graduate with a diploma and get work experience and stability.

Mr. Hayes stated that he is the Executive Director of <u>Journeys of Hope</u>, which helps at-risk youth, 18-23. They are vocation focused, working with youth in their commercial kitchen. They also have a new vocational program at Salem High School.

Ms. D'Angelo stated that she is the member education rep at MassHealth, providing presentations of the MassHealth insurance program, and can present at agencies. She noted that the online application is functioning better than last year.

Ms. Brown stated that at NSCAP, she works with the stabilization manager, working with families.

Ms. Corzo stated that she is also working at NSCAP in stabilization for families who are homeless.

Ms. Smith stated that NSCAP provides fuel assistance, free Adult Basic Education and a weatherization program.

Ms. Orlando stated that she is the site director for <u>Family Continuity</u> located Peabody, a non-profit mental health agency serving 27 communities for persons of all ages.

Ms. Hawthorne stated that she is the program coordinator at <u>Anchor to Windward</u>, a social club located in Marblehead, for adults with disabilities ages 18-65. They have speakers come in.

Mr. Murphy stated that the <u>Independent Living Center</u> helps adults with disabilities work independently and helps people that don't need to be in nursing and group homes to get out.

Ms. Snow stated that she is the business service rep at North Shore Career Center. Their Lynn office will be closing, with the exception of the youth center. Gloucester and Salem will remain. She noted that minimum wage is \$9 as of January and will go up yearly until \$11.00 in 2017.

Ms. Sours stated that <u>Seven Hills</u> supports adults and children with disabilities. They have adult foster care. They also have a shared living program and are looking for a shared living provider on the North Shore.

\$46,997 (\$52,427 if married filing jointly) with three of more qualifying children

\$43,756 (\$49,186 if married filing jointly) with two qualifying children

\$38,511 (\$43,941 if married filing jointly) with one qualifying child

\$14,590 (\$20,020 if married filing jointly) with no qualifying children
