March meeting hosted by Children's Friend and Family Services, Inc.

The March, 2015 Salem HOPE meeting was hosted by Children's Friend and Family Services, Inc (CFFS). Representing the agency was Jeannette Coleman and Stephanie Sladen. Present were Jane Guy of the City of Salem DPCD, Jill Bowen of Catholic Charities, Grant Murphy and Jack Soslak of Independent Living Center of the North Shore and Cape Ann, Inc ILCNSCA., Jake Lefker of North Shore CDC, Carol Hawthorne of Anchor to Windward, Jen Orlando of Family Continuity, Michael Pavetto of Bass River, Teury Marte of MA

Rehabilitation Commission, Susan Knight and Katina Polemenako of Salvation Army, Anne-Marie O'Keefe of North Shore Youth Career Center, Maureen Fiore of North Shore Infant & Toddler Program and Allyson Boyington of CASA.

Ms. Sladen welcomed the group and stated that she was the Assistant Executive Director of CFFS, an organization rooted in Salem since 1837. It began as an organization of several women who cared about women and children who were left behind by the men who went to sea and never returned. It was a settlement house model that evolved into a behavioral health organization. There are four sites – Salem, Gloucester, Lawrence and Lynn. They have a volunteer youth mentoring program, a teen parent program at Salem High School and a contract for clinics for juveniles.

Ms. Coleman stated that she is the Site Director in Salem. The have a traditional out-patient clinic to outreach in the community, such as schools, homes or wherever families are located. They have inhome family therapy and one to one therapeutic mentoring. They partner with the Plummer Home's 90 day On Point Program, providing clinical groups. They partner with Salem Public Schools to provide groups at the high school for stress management. They partner with LEAP for Education for their college success program.

Ms. Bowen stated that <u>Catholic Charities</u> provides a basic needs program, funding direct emergency assistance in Salem, Peabody and Beverly. The provide rental assistance to avoid eviction and assistance with utilities to avoid disconnection. They have a gift card program to Market Basket. They offer a ELL program with North Shore CDC, for which there is a waiting list.

Ms. Hawthorne stated that <u>Anchor to Windward</u> is a social and recreational club for adults with disabilities. They have a bowling league and night activities.

Mr. Murphy stated that the <u>ILCNSCA</u> helps people with disabilities to live more independently. They have an upcoming legislative breakfast with Senator Joan Lovely.

Mr. Soslak stated that he is the new Community Information Specialist with ILCNSCA.

Ms. Boyington stated that at <u>CASA</u> she is an advocate for foster children going through the court system for abuse and neglect. They are now working through Salem court.

Mr. Lefker stated that North Shore CDC's "Everyone Salem" is a partnering and marketing campaign to promote inclusivity for which they host various events. NSCDC also provides affordable housing in Salem and Beverly and first time homebuyer classes. They are receiving applications for students for their Youthbuild program.

Ms. Knight stated that she and Dennis Knight are the new officers at <u>Salvation Army</u>. Officers are typically at a location for five years. The agency provides social services, such as help with utilities and rental assistance, a food pantry, holiday assistance such as toys, youth programs and church on Sunday. Youth programs are 3 nights and included transportation and dinner.

Ms. Polemenako stated that the Salvation Army has a meal program two times per week and a bridging the gap program for offenders aged 12 to 17.

Ms. Orlando stated that she is the Site Director for <u>Family Continuity</u> out of Peabody serving 28 communities with therapeutic mentoring. They partner with Citizens for Adequate Housing for on-site mental health treatment. They have a program for adults experience recent decline of mental status. They have an urgent outpatient program. They are looking for persons who looking to work in the mental health field who speak other languages.

Mr. Pavetto stated that <u>Bass River</u> is headquartered in Beverly and has a site in Salem serving individuals with developmental disabilities. They are working with local restaurants, as well as the Salem Y, to provide jobs and are always looking for new employment opportunities. They recently purchased the former Omega car dealership in order to create a commercial kitchen.

Ms. Marte stated that she is the Area Director for <u>MA Rehabilitation Commission</u> which provides vocational services for persons with disabilities. They are moving at the end of March next to the registry building.

Ms. O'Keefe stated that North Shore Youth Career Center has a F1rst Jobs Program each summer that employees 2-300 youth. The RFP is on the website www.northshorewib.com.

Ms. Fiore stated that North Shore Infant & Toddler Program provides early intervention services for children 0-3 years who are at risk for delays. Services include physical, speech and occupational therapy. They have offices in Salem and Lynn and serve 10 communities. They have toddler and parent/child groups for children in their programs or from the community. They have an early intervention partnership program for pregnant women or for children up to 1 year.

Ms. Guy stated that the draft 5 Year Consolidated Plan and draft FY16 Action Plan will be available for public comment around March 24th. A public hearing is tentatively scheduled for April 3rd. Notices will be posted on www.salem.com.


