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#### **September Meeting Hosted by Salvation Army**

The September, 2017 Salem HOPE meeting was hosted by the <u>Salvation Army</u>. Representing the agency were Captain Susan Knight, along with Katina Polemenako. Present were Jane Guy and Naomi Francisco of the City of Salem DPCD, Iolando Spinola of North Shore CDC, Carol Hawthorne and Angel Soto of Anchor to Windward, Charlene Snow of the North Shore Career Center, Debra Wonson of Salem Coordinated Family and Community Engagement (CFCE), Deborah Barber and Lisa Orgettas of the Independent Living Center of the North Shore and Cape Ann, Inc. (ILCNSCA), Linda LaSpada, Yari Acevedo and Maureen Smith of NSCAP,

Colette O'Hara and Mike Wilson of Children's Friend & Family, Stephanie Jackson of Massachusetts Rehabilitation Commission (MRC), Hailey MacDonald and Stephen Zippilli of Pathways for Children, Matthew Castiglione of Deaf, Inc., Phill Hayes of Bass River and Terrell Greene of New Liberty Innovation School.

Captain Knight welcomed the group and stated that Captain Dennis Knight was in Florida helping feed 1500 people a day for two weeks.

Ms. Polemenako stated that the Salvation Army has a community lunch program all year on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The food pantry is available to Salem, Peabody and Marblehead residents on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The agency provides emergency rental and utility assistance. They have a Tools for Schools Program which provides teacher supplies and backpacks and supplies for students. They have a Bridging the Gap program, which is a 12 week lifeskills course for 12-17 year olds. They also have Backpack 68 at the Collins Middle School which is backpack of food for youth to take home on Friday.

Captain Knight stated that the Christmas season includes angel cards. Salem residents can sign up to get toys for children. There is also Thanksgiving Dinner sign-ups. They are looking for bell ringers.

Ms. Francisco stated that she is the City's Housing Coordinator and administers the <u>housing programs</u> for low to moderate income households, including the First Time Homebuyer Program for downpayments and closing costs and the Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program for emergency reparis, code violations or handicap access.

Md. Jackson stated that <u>MA Rehabilitation Commission</u> helps persons with disabilities become employed. They are having a workshop and open house for the transition planning process for children with a disability approaching the age of 14 to 21.

Ms. Orgettas stated that she is the Executive Director of the <u>Independent Living Center of the North Shore and Cape Ann, Inc.</u> (ILCNSCA). The agency is run by persons with disabilities to assist persons with disabilities. They provide peer counselign, life skills assistance, transitional services, an options program for persons in institutions or at risk of being in institutions and they connect people with resources and provide individual counselling.

Ms. Barber stated that ILCNSCA universal housing applications are difficult, and that they have a group setting to help people fill them out on the first Wednesday each month from 2-4pm. They have an LGBTQ peer support group on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday each month from 6-7pm. These are at 27 Congress Street, Suite 107.

Mr. Hayes stated that <u>Bass River</u> has a communal kitchen and provides food training.

Ms. MacDonald stated that <u>Pathways for Children</u> is a head start facility for ages 3-5 from income eligible families. The will be offering a Nurturing Program in Beverly with transportation for Salem families.

Terrell Greene stated that <u>New Liberty Innovation School</u> is a high school for ages 14-21, which provides academics, employment work readiness and social/emotion learning.

Ms. Wonson stated that <u>Salem CFCE</u> provides all free services. They have a Parent Child Home Program providing home visits for ages 2-3. They provide resources and referrals and every program is parent/child. They are looking for Council members.

Ms. Snow stated that North Shore Career Center is having a Hire a Vet conference that is open to all looking for employment, not just vets, at the Salem 5 community room on November 1<sup>st</sup>.

Ms. Hawthorne stated that <u>Anchor To Windward</u> serves the North Shore. They provide social events for persons with disabilities including a bowling league and Friday night gatherings.

Ms. LaSpada of <u>NSCAP</u> stated that they provide fuel assistance, serving over 3000 clients on the North Shore last year. Applications are available and she is setting up appointments. Her extension is 136.

Yari Acevedo stated that NSCAP has an Adult Basic Education Program, ESL classes and Citizenship class. They offer a Housing Pathways program for homeless families.

Mr. Castiglione stated that he is the Regional Director for <u>Deaf, Inc.</u> at 35 Congress Street. There are six offices from Lawrence to Cape Cod. There is a part time position available in the Salem office, as well as a full time position in the Lawrence office.

Iolando Spinola stated that he is a fellow community development organizer with North Shore CDC in the Point Neighborhood. There is a language exchange program coming up. There is also a block party for the urban art museum on September 30<sup>th</sup>. They will soon be opening Espacio, a community space for classes and

events, etc. They also provide Youthbuild program which provides an alternative route for workforce development in order to work toward a GED and prepare for a trade.

Ms. Arcisz stated that she is a Job Specialist with <u>Goodwill</u>. They have a community based day program. They provide job crews for mobile worksites, such as A & J King Bakery on Boston Street. They are in process of getting a lease at the former Special Thoughts in Danvers.

Ms. Rosenberg stated that Goodwill is looking for volunteer opportunities and entry level jobs.

Mr. Wilson of <u>Children's Friend & Family Services</u> stated that there is no waiting list for therapeutic mentoring or in-home therapy. They have a family GPS grant for Salem and Lynn families, which will provide positive parenting classes and a program with Leap, Salem High School and the Plummer Home to do hiking groups and mindfulness training.

Ms. Guy reminded members that they can forward information to her to be distributed to the Salem HOPE email distribution list.

facing possible eviction or termination of services. Assistance is based upon available resources and client sustainability. Referrals are also provided to other agencies that may have the ability to assist. Funded in part by the City of Salem Department of Planning & Community Development, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. This program does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, gender or gender identity, familial status, disability, ancestry, age, marital status, public assistance status, sexual orientation, veteran history/military status or genetic information.

**Backpack68:** This program recognizes that in the City of Salem 70% of students qualify for free/reduced lunch. There is concern in the community that those students lack access to enough nutritional food over the weekend. Working with Salem High School, The Salvation Army provides bags of food that contain items that provide identified students with enough food for two meals per day per person in the household with an average of three household members.

**Community Lunch Program:** A nutritious lunch is served in a safe environment Tuesdays and Thursdays at noon. The program is open to all. Doors open at 11:00a.m. for a time of fellowship and outreach to those who attend the program.

**Bridging the Gap:** Bridging the Gap is a twelve week life skills course for at-risk youth and first time offenders age 12-17 years. The curriculum is designed to assist in developing the tools to avoid reoffending, empowering them in successful decision making, self respect, goal setting, personal responsibility, anger management, health and relationship building. Upon completion of the program students have no record. Classes are held Tuesdays and Thursdays 4:30p.m.-6:30p.m.

**Tools for Life/Steps Forward:** A twelve week series of workshops for adults held Wednesdays from 10:00a.m.-Noon. Topics include: Money management, cooking on a budget, healthy living, anger management, talking to your teens and more.

**Cot Shelter:** A seasonal emergency bed shelter for men open only during extreme cold nights. Working with the local Police Department and the City shelter the shelter is only open as an overflow location and only if the City determines and emergency. The shelter is staffed by volunteers.

**His Pins:** A six week Archery Program for youth age 8 and abov.

**Pathways of Hope:** Program designed to assist families in developing goals and plans for a successful future. Connecting them with referrals, case management, support and resources.

**Beverly/Salem Elks Tools for School:** Assists Salem students (K-12) and their teachers with activities and supplies throughout the school year. Administered through the Salvation Army.
