### Fire Detection and Alarm System Service, Repair and Testing For the Salem School District

The City of Salem, through its Purchasing Office, invites qualified bidders for Service, Repair & Testing of Fire Alarm Systems in the Salem School District; including all labor and materials and to provide annual inspection, testing, and maintenance to the fire alarm systems.

### I. GENERAL INFORMATION AND BID SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS.

1. Bids can be obtained from and will be accepted at the City of Salem Purchasing Office, 93 Washington Street. 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor, Salem MA, 01970 beginning on Wednesday, August 12, 2015. Office hours are Monday-Wednesday 8am-4pm, Thursday 8am-7pm and Friday 8am-Noon. Bids must be delivered to the Purchasing Office in a sealed envelope by or before 2:00 PM Wednesday, August 26, 2015 and will at that time be publicly opened forthwith. Bid documents may also be viewed and downloaded at the Purchasing Department webpage located at <a href="www.salem.com">www.salem.com</a>. A contract will be awarded to the lowest responsible and eligible bidder within thirty (30) days after the bid opening and shall be awarded in accordance with the provisions of M.G.L. c. 149 S.44E. One original and two copies of the bid are required.

The bid envelope must be sealed and clearly marked: Bid R-01 for Fire Alarm System's Testing Maintenance

- 1) Award date. Award will be made within thirty (30) days after bid opening unless otherwise stated in the specifications or the time for award is extended by mutual consent of all parties. All bids submitted shall be valid for a minimum period of thirty (30) calendar days following the date established for acceptance.
- 2) If any changes are made to this IFB, an addendum will be issued. Addenda will be sent via email, facsimile or as deemed most appropriate by the Purchasing Agent, to all bidders on record as having requested the IFB. All addenda will also be posted on the city website.
- 3) Questions concerning this IFB must be submitted in writing via email: Whitney Haskell at whaskell@salem.com at least five (5) business days prior to the bid opening. Written responses will be sent via email, facsimile or as deemed most appropriate by the Purchasing Agent, to all bidders on record as having requested the IFB in the form of an addendum. All addenda will also be posted on the city website.
- 4) Bids may be modified, corrected or withdrawn only by written correspondence received by the City of Salem prior to the time and date set for the bid opening. Bid modifications must be submitted in a sealed envelope clearly labeled "Modification No. \_\_\_\_" and must reference the original IFB.
- 5) After the bid opening, a bidder may not change any provision of the bid in a manner prejudicial to the interests of the City of Salem or fair competition. Minor informalities will be waived or the bidder will be allowed to correct them. If a mistake and the intended bid are clearly evident on the face of the bid document, the mistake will be corrected to reflect the intended bid, and the bidder will be notified in writing; the bidder may not withdraw the bid. A bidder may withdraw a bid if a mistake is clearly evident on the face of the bid, but the intended correct bid is not similarly evident.
- 6) The City of Salem reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any informality in bids received whenever such rejection or waiver is in its best interest.

- 7) The City of Salem will not be responsible for any expenses incurred in preparing and submitting bids. All bids shall become the property of the City of Salem.
- 8) Responders must be willing to enter into the City of Salem's standard form of contract that will include the scope of services description of this IFB.
- 9) The bid, and any subsequent contract for the services, is hereby issued in accordance with applicable Massachusetts General Laws. The selected bidder shall be expected to comply with all applicable state and federal laws in performance of service.
- 10) Bids received prior to the date of opening will be securely kept, unopened. No responsibility will attach to an officer or person for the premature opening of a bid not properly addressed and identified.
- 11) Any bids received after the advertised date and time for opening will be returned to the responder unopened. The time stamp clock located in the Purchasing Office will be the sole indicator and determinant for the acceptance of bids.
- 12) Purchases by the City of Salem are exempt from federal, state and municipal sales and/or excise taxes.
- 13) Attachment "B" The Tax Compliance Certification and the Certificate of Non-Collusion must be signed and included with the bid response. Attachment "C" OSHA Certification must be signed and included with the bid response. Attachment "D" Statement regarding the payment of prevailing wages, must be signed and included with this bid response. The bid must be signed by the authorized individual(s).
- 14) Unexpected closures. If, at the time of the scheduled bid opening, City Hall is closed due to uncontrolled events such as fire, snow, ice, wind or building evacuation, the bid opening will be postponed until 2:00 PM on the next normal business day. Bids will be accepted until that date and time.
- 15) The City of Salem is an Affirmative Action/Equal Opportunity Employer. The City encourages bids from qualified MBE/DBE/WBE firms.
- 16) Bidders should be aware that many overnight mailing services do not guarantee that deliveries will be received on time at the Salem Purchasing Office. Those hand delivering bid packages should also take note that parking is extremely limited around the building and should take the necessary steps to ensure that the bid is delivered prior to the due date and time.

### 17) PREVAILING WAGE

Pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws, chapter 149, sections 26 and 27, the Division of Occupational Safety (formerly the Department of Labor and Industries) has determined the **Prevailing Wage Rates** for this work. The enclosed rates apply only to this work. The Prevailing Wage shall become part of the contract signed between the successful bidder and the awarding authority or the contract is invalid. Prevailing Wages must be paid to all persons employed on the public works project, regardless of whether they are employed by the successful bidder or a subcontractor. The wage rates issued for each project shall be paid for the entire project.

Payroll records must be kept by the successful bidder for all persons employed on the project. A separate Statement of Compliance must be submitted to the Division of Occupational Safety by every employer, including all prime contractors and subcontractors, when its portion of the work is completed. The enclosed form entitled "Weekly Payroll Records Report and Statement of Compliance" clearly details these requirements. A certified payroll must be submitted to the Purchasing Office for each week work is performed for the City under this contract.

- 18) The City of Salem will not be responsible for any expenses incurred in preparing and submitting bids. All bids shall become the property of the City of Salem.
- 19) Responders must be willing to enter in the City of Salem's Standard form of contract (Attachment A) that will include the scope of services description of this IFB.
- 20) Contract Length: This will be a three (3) year contract with no options to extend.
- 21) Cancellation of contract: The City of Salem reserves the right to cancel and terminate the contract in the event that the services provided by the Contractor prove to be unsatisfactory.
- 22) Each bid shall be accompanied by a 5% bid deposit (5% of the overall value of the bid). The bid deposit may be in the form of a certified, treasurer's or cashier's check from a responsible bank or trust company made payable to the City of Salem, or a bid bond from a surety company. Bid deposits except those of the three lowest responsible and eligible bidders, will be returned within 10 days after the opening of the bids. The bid deposits of the three lowest responsible and eligible bidders will be returned upon execution of the contract or at the expiration of thirty (30) days after opening of the bids if no award is made; except that, if any bidder fails to perform his/her agreement to execute a contract and furnish the required bond or security deposit, his/her bid deposit shall become and be the property of the City of Salem as liquidated damages.
- 23) The contractor shall furnish to the City of Salem and pay the premium for a payment bond in the amount of %50 of the value of the contract and in such form as the City shall prescribe, and with a surety company qualified to do business under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

# City of Salem School Department Salem, Massachusetts Specification for Fire Detection and Alarm System Service, Repair and Testing

### **SECTION 1: GENERAL INFORMATION**

Sealed bids are invited from companies engaged in the sale, installation, service and testing of fire detection and alarm systems. Bids shall be accepted from companies who have provided contractual service, maintenance and testing of fire detection and alarm systems for a minimum of (3) three years, and can provide (24) twenty-four hour a day service personnel, equipment repair and replacement parts as may be required for the following (9) nine school department facilities.

Note: The City of Salem reserves the right to cancel service or testing on any school facility that may close during the term of the service and testing contract. New Liberty Charter School shall be included in the first year of the contract, but may be removed thereafter.\*

A credit equal to the full cost of providing any remaining annual or quarterly testing shall be refunded to the City of Salem School Department for any school facility that may be removed from service during the term of the contract.

The full cost of providing testing services for a newly commissioned site shall be provided to the Director of Building Services, City of Salem School Department (Director) prior to becoming part of the service and testing contract. This information shall be provided to the Director upon notification to the service provider of the need, and frequency and scope of any additional testing services which may be required during the term of the contract.

All prospective bidders shall be required to visit each of the listed facilities, and to conduct their own survey of each facility in order to: familiarize themselves with the facility and with the in-place equipment, the operation and present condition of the equipment, and the scope of services required to provide for the testing of all fire detection initiating devices and alarm devices. The selected bidder, hereafter also known as either/or the service and testing company, service provider or service company, shall provide all required service, repairs, and testing in full compliance with all City of Salem ordinances or specific requirements, Commonwealth of Massachusetts General Laws Chapters 141, 142, 143 and National Fire Protection Association (N.F.P.A.) codes and standards, N.F.P.A. 72 and others governing fire detection and alarm systems.

#### ADDENDA AND INTERPRETATION

No interpretation of the meaning of the specification, scope of services or contractor requirements will be made to any bidder orally. All requests for such an interpretation of the meaning of the specification or for clarification of the contractor qualifications or requirements, and questions regarding the physical plant, alarm and fire detection systems of each school shall be addressed in writing to:

All requests must be received at least (10) ten days prior to the bid opening date. A copy of all requests for information and the response shall be provided to all prospective bidders in a written addendum.

The failure of any bidder to receive such addenda or interpretation shall not relieve the bidder from any obligation under his proposal as submitted. All addenda shall become part of the contract document.

### **SECTION 2: QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS**

The Director and/or the Awarding Authority for the City of Salem, and/or the Chief of the City of Salem Fire Department may make such investigations that are deemed necessary to determine the ability of the bidder to perform the required work or to deliver the required services. This will include checking references on past performance. The bidder shall furnish to the agents of the City of Salem all such information and data as may be requested for this purpose. The City of Salem through its agents reserves the right to reject any bid if the evidence submitted by or the investigation of such bidder fails to satisfy the agents of the City of Salem that such bidder is properly qualified to meet the obligations of the contract and to satisfactorily complete the work contemplated herein.

### QUALIFICATION REQUIREMENTS OF THE SERVICE AND TESTING COMPANY FOR FIRE DETECTION AND ALARM SYSTEMS

All prospective bidders shall be required to satisfactorily meet the following:

- 1. The service and testing company's principal business shall be the installation, repair, service and testing of fire detection and alarm systems.
- 2. The service and testing company shall own and operate a fully licensed independent or fully licensed franchised fire detection and alarm system company, and shall be fully authorized to service, repair and test each manufacturer of fire detection and alarm systems installed in City of Salem School Facilities. Certification of this authorization to service, repair and test in place school department fire detection and alarm system is required and shall be provided with the submitted bid documents.
- 3. The service and testing company shall be the holder of a current and valid Commonwealth of Massachusetts Division of Registration of Electrician Master Electrician Contractor License Certificate A or Registered System Contractor License Certificate C. The service and testing contractor shall be in full compliance with the provision of the MGL 141S 1 10; MGL 142 3C 3P; MGL 143 61 65; National Fire Protection Association codes and standards NFPA 72.
- 4. The service and testing company shall have in its employ repair, installation, and testing personnel who are fully licensed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and shall be the holder of a valid and current Commonwealth of Massachusetts Board of State Examiners of Electrician Certificate B Journeyman Electrician License or Certificate D Systems Technician License. Proof of such shall be provided to the Satisfaction of the Director. Such personnel shall be properly trained and familiar with the installation

service, repair and testing requirements of each manufacturer of fire detection and alarm system installed in City of Salem School Facilities.

- 5. The service and testing company shall be capable of providing (24) twenty-four hours per day (7) seven days per week, (365) three hundred sixty-five days per year emergency service and shall respond to all calls within (1) one hour and provide service at the affected site within (3) three hours; fire detection and alarm system reset, and restoral service or initiating device repair or replacement service within (1) one hour of a notice for emergency service, repair or system reset and restoral at any City of Salem school facility.
- 6. The service and testing company shall provide to the Director, documentation of possessing the technical expertise, manufacturer service authorization, and possession of a copy of all service manuals, and factory service bulletins, user manuals, installation manuals to properly service, repair, test, maintain or modify the presently installed fire detection and alarm system installed in City of Salem school facilities. No additional charges shall be paid by the City of Salem or the City of Salem School Department for the purchase of any user manuals, installation service manuals, guides, computer programs, computer software upgrades or equipment or specialized tools or diagnostics devices that may be required by the service and testing company to properly service and repair the in-place equipment or systems at City of Salem school facilities.
- 7. The service and testing company shall provide documentation of a minimum of (3) three years experience in the installation, service and testing of fire detection and alarm systems.
- 8. The service and testing company shall have in its employ personnel who are qualified to instruct/train school department personnel in the proper operation of the in-place equipment in City of Salem school facilities. This training or instruction shall be provided as needed upon the request of the Superintendent of the City of Salem School Department or his/her designee. The hourly fee for this service shall not be greater than the agreed hourly rate for a service technician.
- 9. The service and testing company shall have in its employ trained operators who can respond (24) twenty-four hours a day to ensure immediate attention to all requests for service. Records of the City of Salem School Department's Fire Detection and Alarm Systems as installed shall be maintained in the service company's headquarters and shall be available (24) twenty-four hours a day in order to insure prompt and efficient service. A request for emergency service (24) twenty-four hours a day shall not be between an intermediary (telephone answering service) and the service and testing company.
- 10. A direct line is to be provided to City of Salem School Department personnel and City of Salem Fire Department and City of Salem Police Department for use by them in communicating with the service and testing company for proper and efficient maintenance and emergency service.

### SECTION 3: SERVICE AND REPAIR REQUIREMENTS Service and Repairs

- 1. The service and testing company shall provide emergency service as may be required (24) twenty-four hours a day, (7) seven days a week, (365) three hundred sixty-five days a year as follows:
  - a. When notified, the service contractor will respond by telephone within (1) one hour to alarm activations or to a request for service to reset or repair a fire detection and alarm system, and/or sprinkler system alarm initiating devices and restore the system to a normal operating condition and provide service at the affected site within (3) three hours.
- 2. The service and testing company shall provide only new and unused replacement parts, detection and alarm system components and/or equipment to affect any needed repair or component replacement that may be required to return a system to a normal operating condition unless otherwise accepted by the City of Salem Director of Building Services. A minimum of a (12) twelve month warranty shall apply against all defects in workmanship and manufacture. The warranty shall provide complete coverage for parts, equipment, electronic components, labor, delivery cost and travel and truck charges for the full (12) twelve months of the warranty period.
- 3. The service and testing contractor shall provide upon reasonable notice (1) one or more to a maximum of (2) two technicians to provide all labor and services which may be required to assist the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Department of Public Safety, Division of Inspections, state fire alarm inspector in conducting the annual fire safety inspection of all school department fire detection and alarm systems. The cost of this service shall be invoiced at the agreed upon hourly rate for a technician during normal business hours as listed in Section 7 Cost of Testing Service, Repair, Labor and Materials.
- 4. All other service and repairs shall be performed at other than normal school hours in order to prevent interruptions or interference with normal school activities. The City of Salem Fire Department through the office of Fire Prevention, may determine that a needed repair may be of an emergency nature such that the work must be performed during school hours.
- 5. The service and testing company shall maintain an adequate inventory of replacement components or have immediate access to replacement components to properly service, repair and test, in a timely fashion, all makes, models and series of in-place fire detection and alarm systems installed in City of Salem school facilities.
- 6. The service and testing contractor shall work directly with the City of Salem School Department Director of Building Services and City of Salem School Department Business Manager to resolve all equipment, service and testing issues in order to ensure a fully functioning trouble free and reliable fire detection and alarm system with the City of Salem School Department. No replacement work shall be undertaken without the expressed approval of the Director of Building Services or the Business Manager.

### SECTION 4: PROCEDURES FOR TESTING OF ALARM DEVICES AND ALARM INITIATING DEVICES

### Testing of Alarm Initiating Devices and Alarm Devices

1. Provide for the inspection, testing and documentation of the test results of the activation and response of all heat, water flow, manual pull stations, and smoke detecting devices and all audio/visual alarm devices, main control, standby power systems, and remote annunciation devices that comprise the fire detection and alarm system at each of the listed school facilities.

### Test Schedule and Interval

1. The test series shall consist of (4) four scheduled test periods at intervals as approved by the City of Salem Office of Fire Prevention and as directed by the City of Salem School Department. The test interval shall be scheduled as follows unless otherwise directed: June/July Summer Recess

December Holiday Recess February Winter Recess April Spring Recess

### Fire Detection and Alarm System Testing Requirements

- 1. The annual test is to include one hundred percent of all devices, including control units, heat detectors, smoke detectors, pull stations, sprinkler flow switches, sprinkler system valve, tamper switches, horns, audio visual devices, master boxes and all associated equipment to assure proper operation of each device and each system.
- 2. During the second and subsequent tests at intervals of which coincide with scheduled school recess, there shall be an inspection and test of the operation of the systems. Such inspections and tests shall consist of the following operations with respect to apparatus and equipment forming all or any part of the fire detection, alarm, and sprinkler systems.
  - a. Test and inspect all control units circuitry, connecting points, relays, power supply operating controls, indicators, components, battery charging circuitry, stand-by battery, fuses, wiring and all circuitry necessary to provide local supervision of the system and transmit signals over the municipal circuit to the fire department.
  - b. All power supply units utilizing storage batteries shall be inspected to insure that they are operating properly, are able to hold a charge and for cleanliness.
  - c. At least one-third of the heat and smoke detectors, but not less than (2) two detectors on each circuit shall be tested. Different devices shall be tested at each subsequent test, so that at the end of (1) one year, all detectors will have been tested for the second time.
  - d. At least one-third of the smoke detectors, but not less than (2) two detectors on each circuit shall be tested. Different devices shall be tested at each subsequent test, so that at the end of (1) one year all detectors will have been tested for a second time.
  - e. At least one-third of the manual alarm pull stations shall be tested. Different devices shall be tested at each subsequent test, so that at the end of (1) one year all manual alarm pull stations will have been tested for a second time.
  - f. All audible and visual signals shall be tested at each test period.
  - g. Each master fire alarm box shall be tripped at least (2) two times from each initiating circuit zone during each test period.
  - h. (50%) fifty percent of all tests shall be made on the primary power supply and (50%) fifty percent on secondary power supply.

- 3. Repairs, adjustments and replacement of parts, materials apparatus and equipment forming all or any part of the fire detection, alarm and sprinkler systems alarm initiative device shall be as follows:
  - a. If required as a result of the test, inspection or service call, any devices indicating trouble shall be adjusted, cleaned and or reset for proper operation at no additional charges.
  - b. All service, repair or device replacement as a result of vandalism, floods, fire, freezing and acts of God when not necessitated as a result of the contractors test inspection or service call upon prior approval of the Director shall be paid in accordance with the hourly rate for labor and the cost of replacement components as stated in **Section 7 Cost Testing, Service, Repair, Labor and Materials** of this specification. The minimum charge for service calls and the hourly labor rate for repairs shall be listed and agreed upon by the City of Salem School Department prior to becoming part of any contract between the service contractor and the City of Salem School Department. The estimated number of service calls per contract year is (4) four. The estimated repair hours required by quarter is (8) eight hours. The cost of replacement components shall be identified by base cost of the component and the contractor mark up.
  - c. Sufficient amount of spare parts for all systems shall be maintained at all times by the service company to prevent an extended shut down due to a component failure resulting in a malfunction of the system.
  - d. Sprinkler system pipes and water supply, water pressure boosting equipment, or sprinkler system maintenance are not part of this proposed contract.

### 4. Reports and Record Keeping

The City of Salem School Department and the City of Salem Fire Department shall be furnished with a comprehensive report of each inspection, test or service call results after each visit and a copy shall be kept on file by the service company for (5) five years and available to the City of Salem School Department or its representative upon request. The report shall list every device tested and indicate if it passed.

### 5. Number of Service Company Personnel for Testing

A minimum of at least two persons normally employed by the service company on a full time basis in the capacity of installing, inspecting and testing fire detection and alarm systems shall be provided to perform all testing.

### 6. Use of School Department Equipment

No School Department equipment, ladder, scaffolding platforms, or other equipment shall be used in the testing or maintenance of the systems. The service company is to provide and have immediately available all equipment necessary for the proper testing and maintenance of the systems.

7. The service and testing company personnel shall protect all school department equipment and building surfaces including all furniture, painted surfaces such as walls, doors, door frames, and all floors, and windows from damage when providing either service or testing services. The service and testing contractor shall be responsible for all damage that may be caused by service company personnel. All such damage shall be replaced or repaired at the service company's expense. Additionally the contractor is responsible for cleaning up any dirt or debris and trash removal associated with their work.

### 8. Licensed Fire Alarm Technicians

The service company shall have either a Certified A – Master Electrician Contractor License or at minimum a Certified-C Systems Contractor's License and be qualified by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to employ

Licensed Journeyman Electricians, Licensed Fire Alarm Technicians and shall have such licensed Journeyman Electrician and/or Fire Alarm Technicians in its normal full time employ to perform repairs and installations that may be necessary from time to time.

#### **SECTION 5: TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT**

#### 1. Term of the Contract

The Contract period for the service repair and testing of the fire detection and alarm systems in City of Salem School Facilities shall be for a (3) three year period commencing on September 1, 2015 and terminating on August 31, 2018.

### 2. Payment

a. Payments for contractual testing shall be made in (4) four installments. A payment for the mandated periodic testing of the fire detection and alarm system shall be made upon receipt of an invoice for the cost of the service for conducting the test. The invoice shall identify the cost of providing the testing at the individual facilities.

**Note**: The aggregate total cost of the periodic tests shall not be greater than the agreed contractual cost of the contract for this service.

b. Payments for "on call" emergency service or routine service and repairs shall be made upon the receipt of an invoice for the service or repair performed. The invoice for the service and repair shall identify the cost of labor and materials that were required to affect the repair. The cost of labor and the cost of replacement components or equipment shall be charged according to the cost of labor and materials as defined in Section 7 "Cost of testing, service, repairs, labor and materials" of this specification.

### 3. Cancellation of the Agreement

The City of Salem School Department through the Superintendent of Schools and/or the City of Salem Awarding Authority (City of Salem Purchasing Agent) reserves the right to terminate this agreement upon a (30) thirty day written notice of the intent to terminate the contract.

### **SECTION 6: CONTRACTOR REQUIREMENTS**

1. All bidders shall provide with the submitted bid the name, address, telephone number of the principal of the company who is the holder of the valid Commonwealth of Massachusetts Division of Examiner of Electrician Certificate A Master Electrician Contractor License or Certificate C Systems Contractor License.

A copy of the license shall be included with the submitted bid.

### Compliance with Laws and Regulations

The service and testing contractor shall fully comply with all general laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, all policies and guidelines of the City of Salem School Committee, and all pertinent ordinances of the City of Salem, and all National Fire Protection Association codes and standards including, but not limited to:

Massachusetts General Laws

M.G.L. Chapter 30 Section 39S – Ten hour OSHA Training for all employees assigned to Salem

M.G.L. Chapter 71 Section 37H – Tobacco Free School

M.G.L. Chapter 71 Section 38R – Criminal Offense Record Inquiry

M.G.L. Chapter 141 Section 1-10 Inclusively

M.G.L. Chapter 149 Section26 through 27H prevailing wage rates – prevailing wage rates do not apply for testing.

However all repair and installation work is subject to the prevailing wage laws.

### CITY OF SALEM CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

This agreement is made and entered into by and between the City of Salem (hereinafter the CITY), a municipal corporation organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, and (hereinafter the CONTRACTOR).

### ARTICLE 1. DEFINITION.

This CONTRACT as used herein shall mean these articles, and the "contract documents" which include but are not limited to the following identified items and all documents, and forms submitted therewith, or attached hereby.

- θ Attachment A: Scope of Services, and/or other bid package materials
- θ Attachment B: Additional Contract Terms and Conditions
- θ Attachment C: Statement of Corporate Authority

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### ARTICLE II. AMOUNT AND DURATION.

This CONTRACT in an amount not to exceed shall commence on or about and shall terminate no later than from the execution of this contract, unless a written amendment to renew or extend this contract is executed in accordance with the provisions of this CONTRACT.

#### ARTICLE III. PERFORMANCE.

### ARTICLE IV. TERMINATION.

- i) Without Cause. The CITY may terminate this CONTRACT on sixty (60) calendar days notice, or may suspend this CONTRACT for up to sixty (60) calendar days upon receipt of notice, when in the best interests of the City by providing notice to the CONTRACTOR, which shall be in writing and shall be deemed delivered and received when given in person to the CONTRACTOR, or when received by fax, express mail, certified mail return receipt requested, regular mail postage prepaid or delivered by any other appropriate method evidencing actual receipt by the CONTRACTOR.
- ii) For Cause. If the CONTRACTOR is determined by the CITY to be in default of any term or condition of CONTRACT, the CITY may terminate this contract on thirty (30) days notice by providing notice to the CONTRACTOR, which shall be in writing and shall be deemed delivered and received when given in person to the CONTRACTOR, or when received by fax, express mail, certified mail return receipt requested, regular mail postage prepaid or delivered by any other appropriate method evidencing actual receipt by the CONTRACTOR. If the CITY is determined by the CONTRACTOR to be in default of any term or condition of this CONTRACT the CONTRACTOR may terminate this contract on thirty (30) days notice by providing notice to the CITY, which shall be in writing and shall be deemed delivered and received when given in person to the CITY, or when received by fax, express mail, certified mail return

- receipt requested, regular mail postage prepaid or delivered by any other appropriate method evidencing actual receipt by the CITY.
- iii) Default. The following shall constitute events of default under this CONTRACT: a) any material misrepresentation made by the CONTRACTOR to the CITY, b) any failure to perform any of its obligations under this CONTRACT including, but not limited to the following: (i) failure to commence performance of this CONTRACT at the time specified in this CONTRACT due to a reason or circumstance within the CONTRACTOR'S reasonable control, (ii) failure to perform this CONTRACT with sufficient personnel and equipment or with sufficient material to ensure the completion of this CONTRACT within the specified time due to a reason or circumstance within the CONTRACTOR'S reasonable control, (iii) failure to performance this CONTRACT in a manner reasonably satisfactory to the CITY, (iv) failure to promptly re-perform with reasonable time the services that were rejected by the CITY as unsatisfactory, or erroneous, (v) discontinuance of the services for reasons not beyond the CONTRACTOR'S reasonable control, (vi) failure to comply with a material term of this CONTRACT, including, but not limited to, the provision of insurance and nondiscrimination, and (vii) any other acts specifically and expressly stated in this CONTRACT as constituting a basis for termination of this CONTRACT, and (viii) failure to comply with any and all requirements of state law, and/or regulations, and City ordinances, and/or regulations.

### ARTICLE V. REMEDIES OF THE CITY.

The CITY may deduct the cost of any substitute contract or performance for expenses, losses, and all damages, including incidental and consequential damages as a result of any event of non-conformance or non-performance of the CONTRACTOR in complying with the terms of this CONTRACT, and shall withhold such expenses, losses, and damages from sums due, or to become due.

### ARTICLE VI. REMEDIES OF THE CONTRACTOR.

If the damages, other than loss, non-conformance, or non-performance, are actually sustained by the CONTRACTOR due to any act or omission for which the CITY is legally responsible the CITY shall allow a sum equal to the amount of such damages sustained by the Contractor as determined by the CITY in writing, provided the Contractor shall have provided to all signatories of the contract a detailed written statement of such damages and cause thereof within 30 days of the act of omission by the CITY.

### ARTICLE VII. ASSIGNABILITY.

The CONTRACTOR shall not assign, subcontract or in any way transfer any interest in this contract without the prior written consent of the Procurement Officer of said City. In the event of such occurrence the City reserves the right to deal with any assignee subcontractor or transferee directly and the contractor agrees to remain bound by all terms and conditions of this contract in accordance with its original tenor. The provisions of this CONTRACT shall be binding upon, and shall inure to the benefit of, the successors and assigns of the CONTRACTOR and any public body or bodies succeeding the interests of the CITY.

### ARTICLE VIII. INDEMNIFICATION.

The CONTRACTOR shall assume the defense, indemnify and hold harmless the CITY, the CITY'S agents and employees, from and against all losses and all claims, demands, payments, suits, actions, recoveries and judgments of every nature and description brought or recovered against them by reason of acts, in actions, omissions, negligence, reckless or intentional misconduct of the said CONTRACTOR, its agent(s), officers, employees, or subcontractors; in the execution of the work or in guarding the same. Unless otherwise provided by law, the CITY may elect to indemnify the CONTRACTOR for claims arising in tort if it is determined that the CONTRACTOR performed its obligations under this CONTRACT pursuant to the direct supervision and control of the CITY or its designated agent(s).

### ARTICLE IX. WORKER'S COMPENSATION AND OTHER INSURANCE.

The CONTRACTOR shall provide by insurance for the payment of compensation and the furnishing of other benefits under Chapter 152 of the General Laws of Massachusetts (The Worker's Compensation Act) to all

employees of the CONTRACTOR who are subject to the provisions of Chapter 152 of the General Laws of Massachusetts.

Failure to provide and continue in force such insurance during the period of this contract shall be deemed a material breach of this contract, shall operate as an immediate termination thereof, and CONTRACTOR shall indemnify the CITY for all losses, claims, and actions resulting from the failure to provide the insurance required by this Article.

The Contractor shall furnish to the CITY evidence of such insurance prior to the execution of this contract and before the same shall be binding on the parties thereto, except if specifically waived in Attachment B.

Prior to commencement of any work and until completion of its work under this CONTRACT shall maintain the following insurance coverage, at its cost, from insurance acceptable to the CITY, giving evidence of such coverage to the CITY prior to execution of this CONTRACT, a copy of such insurance coverage to be attached herewith:

### **INSURANCE COVERAGE:**

<u>General</u> - The Vendor shall before commencing performance of the Contract be responsible for providing and maintaining insurance coverage in force for the life of the Contract of the kind and in adequate amounts to secure all of the obligations under the Contract and with insurance companies licensed to write insurance in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. All such insurance carried shall not be less than the kinds and amounts designated herein, and the Vendor agrees that the stipulation herein of the kinds and limits of coverage shall in no way limit the liability of the Vendor to any such kinds and amounts of insurance coverage. All policies issued shall indemnify and save harmless the City of Salem, its agents and employees from any and all claims for damages to persons or property as may rise out of the performance of this Contract.

Vendor's Comprehensive General Public Liability and Property Damage Liability Insurance - The Vendor shall carry Comprehensive General Liability Insurance providing for a limit of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injury to or death of one person, and subject to that limit for each person, a total limit of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries or death of two or more persons in any one accident; and Vendor's Comprehensive Property Damage Liability Insurance providing for a limit of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of injury to or destruction of property in any one accident, and subject to that limit per accident, a total (or aggregate) limit or not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of injury to or destruction of property during the policy period.

Comprehensive Automotive and Property Damage Insurance - The Vendor shall carry Automobile Insurance covering all owned vehicles, hired vehicles or non-owned vehicles under the control of the Vendor while performing work under the Contract in the amount of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries to or death of one person and subject to that limit for each person, a total of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for all damages arising out of bodily injuries to or death of two or more persons in any one accident; and Property Damage coverage in the amount of not less than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) for all damages to or destruction of property.

The Vendor must carry Workman's Compensation Insurance in the amounts prescribed under Massachusetts State Law and meet all other City and State Laws and Regulations.

No cancellation(s) of such insurance, whether by the insurer or by the insured party shall be valid unless written notice thereof is given by the parties proposing cancellation to the other party and to the City of

Salem at least fifteen (15) days prior to the intended effective date thereof, which date shall be expressed in said notice, which shall be sent by registered mail, return receipt requested. These provisions shall apply to the legal representative(s), trustee in bankruptcy, receiver, assignee, trustee, and successor(s) in interest of the Vendor.

All insurance coverage shall be at the sole expense of the Vendor and shall be placed with such company as may be acceptable to the City of Salem and shall constitute a material part of the contract documents.

Failure to provide written proof to City and continue in force such insurance as aforesaid shall be deemed a material breach of the contract, and may constitute sufficient grounds for immediate termination of the same.

All required insurance must be endorsed to name the CITY as Additional Insured. All required insurance shall be endorsed to waive the insurer's rights of subrogation against the City. All policies and certificate for insurance must contain language that the insurance shall not be canceled, materially changed or non-renewed without at least thirty (30) days advance written notice to the CITY. The CONTRACTOR under this CONTRACT shall not allow it subcontractors to begin work until similar insurance has been so obtained and certificates of insurance approved by the CONTRACTOR.

### ARTICLE X. CORPORATE CONTRACTOR.

If CONTRACTOR is a corporation, CONTRACTOR shall endorse the Certificate of Corporate Authority for the CONTRACTORS' signatory (Attachment C), or shall otherwise provide a form similar in nature and substance acceptable to the CITY.

If CONTRACTOR is a non-profit corporation, CONTRACTOR shall provide satisfactory proof of present status as a non-profit corporation. Such proof shall be in the form of a certification from the Massachusetts Secretary of State's office and/or from the Internal Revenue Service and shall provide the Federal Tax Identification Number of the non-profit corporation. This agreement shall not be enforceable against the CITY unless and until the CONTRACTOR complies with this section. Failure to inform the CITY in writing of revocation, or other loss of non-profit status shall be deemed a material breach of this contract and operate as an immediate termination thereof.

### ARTICLE XI. SUBJECT TO APPROPRIATION.

The obligations of the CITY under this CONTRACT shall be subject to appropriation. In the absence of appropriation this CONTRACT shall be immediately terminated without liability for damages, penalties, or other charges.

In the requisite circumstances, the obligations of the CITY under this CONTRACT shall be subject to the formal award of the state, federal grant.

### ARTICLE XII. DOCUMENTS, MATERIALS, ETC.

Any materials, reports, information, data, etc. given to or prepared or assembled by the CONTRACTOR under this CONTRACT are to be kept confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the CONTRACTOR (except agents, servants, or employees of the CONTRACTOR) without the prior written approval of the CITY, except as otherwise required by law. The CONTRATOR understands that he/she/it may acquire or have access to "personal data" otherwise kept by the CITY. The CONTRACTOR shall comply with the provisions Chapter 66A of the General Laws of Massachusetts as it relates to public documents, and all other state and federal laws and regulations relating to confidentiality, security privacy and use of confidential data.

Any materials produced in whole or in part under this CONTRACT shall not be subject to copyright, except by the CITY, in the United States or any other country. The CITY shall have unrestricted authority to, without payment of any royalty, commission, or additional fee of any type or nature, publicly disclose, reproduce, distribute and otherwise use, and authorize other to use, in whole or in part, any reports, data or other materials prepared under this CONTRACT.

All data, reports, programs, software, equipment, furnishings, and any other documentation or product paid for by the CITY shall vest in the CITY at the termination of this CONTRACT. The CONTRACTOR shall at all times, during or after termination of this CONTRACT, obtain the prior written approval of the CITY before making any statement bearing on the work performed or data collected under this CONTRACT to the press or issues any material for publication through any medium.

### ARTICLE XIII. AUDIT, INSPECTION, RECORDKEEPING.

At any time during normal business hours, and as often as the CITY may deem it reasonably necessary, there shall be made available in the office of the CONTRACTOR for the purpose of audit, examination, and/or to make excerpts or transcripts, all records, contracts, invoices, materials, payrolls, records of personnel, conditions of employment and other data relating to all matters covered by this agreement.

Further the CONTRACTOR agrees to make its work papers, records and other evidence of audit available to the CITY for a period of three years after final payment under his CONTRACT. The CIT shall be entitled to reproduce any or all such documents at its own expense, for which provision shall be made at such time.

### ARTICLE XIV. WEEKLY PAYROLL RECORDS REPORT.

In accordance with Massachusetts General Law c. 149, s. 27B, a true and accurate record must be kept of all individuals employed on a public works construction project for which prevailing wage rates are applicable.

In addition, every contractor and subcontractor is required to submit, on a weekly basis, a copy of their weekly payroll records to the awarding authority. Once collected, the awarding authority is also required to preserve those records for three years.

### ARTICLE XV. CONFLICT OF INTEREST.

- i) <u>CITY</u>. No officer, member or employee of the CITY and no members of its governing body who exercise any function or responsibility in review or approval of the undertaking or carrying out of this CONTRACT shall participate in any decision relating to the CONTRACT which affects his/her personal interests or the interest of any corporation, partnership, or association in which he/she has a direct or indirect pecuniary interest. None of the services to be provided by the CONTRACTOR shall be used for any partisan political activity or further the election or defeat of any candidate for political office in the CITY. Compliance with this section shall be material to the CONTRACT.
- contractor. Contractor agrees that his/her/its agents, servants, and employees have neither presently nor during the period of this Contract any interest direct or indirect which would impair, detract, or conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services required under this Contract. The Contractor, his/her/its agents, servants or employees further stipulates that in the performance of this Contract, no person having any such interest shall be employed. Conflicts of Interest include but are not limited to (a) immediate family relationships with officials of the CITY, (b) instances where the Contractor, his/her/it agents, servants or employees during the period of this Contract was connected as an officer, employee or member of the governing body of the CITY, and (c) instances where the Contractor has an interest in any CITY department, its agents, servants or employees or parcels of land within the CITY. Compliance with this section shall be material to the Contract.

### ARTICLE XVI. PAYMENT.

The City agrees to make all reasonable efforts to pay to the CONTRACTOR the sum set forth in the CONTRACTOR'S bid or proposal within thirty (30) days of receipt of an invoice at the Office of the City Auditor detailing the work completed.

Subject to pending statutory appeal rights, CONTRACTOR agrees that all sums otherwise due and payable to the CITY for outstanding taxes, fines, fees and or other municipal charges may be deducted from the sum(s) otherwise payable under this CONTRACT prior to disbursement to the CONTRACTOR.

### ARTICLE XVII. CONFLICT.

In the event there is a conflict between these Articles and Attachment A, Attachment A shall supersede these Articles.

### ARTICLE XVIII. WAIVER AND AMENDMENT.

The provisions contained in this CONTRACT may be modified only as specifically provided by ATTACHMENT B - ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS. Amendments, or waivers of any additional term, condition, covenant, duty or obligation contained in this CONTRACT may be made only by written amendment executed by all signatories to the original agreement, prior to the effective date of the amendment.

To the extent allowed by law, all conditions, duties, and obligations contained in this CONTRACT may be waived only by written agreement by both parties.

Forbearance or indulgence in any form or manner by a party shall not be construed as a waiver, nor in any manner limit the legal or equitable remedies available to that party. No waiver by either party of any default or breach shall constitute a waiver of any subsequent default or breach of a similar or different matter.

### ARTICLE XIX. CERTIFICATION.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, THE CONTRACTOR CERTIFIES, UNDER THE PAINS AND PENALTIES OF PERJURY, THAT THE CONTRACTOR IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH EACH OF THE FOLLOWING:

- a. TAXES. PURSUANT to M.G.L. c. 62C, s. 49A, the CONTRACTOR has filed all state tax returns and complied with all laws of the Commonwealth relating to taxes.
- b. DEBARMENT. The CONTRACTOR is not currently debarred or suspended by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, or any of its entities or subdivisions.
- c. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT. The CONTRACTOR is aware of the recently enacted Americans with Disabilities Act which prohibits discrimination based upon disability and shall meet any relevant standards, and/or conditions set out in the bid/proposal documents, bid/proposal specifications, and/or ATTACHMENT A SCOPE OF SERVICES.

### ARTICLE XX. FORUM AND CHOICE OF LAW

This CONTRACT and any performance herein shall be governed by and be construed in accordance with the laws of Commonwealth. Any and all proceedings or actions relating to subject matter herein shall be brought and maintained in the courts of the Commonwealth or the federal district court sitting in the Commonwealth, which shall have exclusive jurisdiction thereof. This paragraph shall not be construed to limit any other legal rights of the parties.

- All apprentices working on the project are required to be registered with the Massachusetts Division of Apprentice Standards (DAS). Apprentice must keep his/her apprentice identification card on his/her person during all work hours on the project. An apprentice registered with DAS may be paid the lower apprentice wage rate at the applicable step as provided on the prevailing wage schedule. If an apprentice rate is not listed on the prevailing wage schedule for the trade in which an apprentice is registered with the DAS, the apprentice must be paid the journeyworker's rate for the trade.
- The wage rates will remain in effect for the duration of the project, except in the case of multi-year public construction projects. For construction projects lasting longer than one year, awarding authorities must request an updated wage schedule. Awarding authorities are required to request these updates no later than two weeks before the anniversary of the date the contract was executed by the awarding authority and the general contractor. For multi-year CM AT RISK projects, awarding authority must request an annual update no later than two weeks before the anniversary date, determined as the earlier of: (a) the execution date of the GMP Amendment, or (b) the execution date of the first amendment to permit procurement of construction services. Contractors are required to obtain the wage schedules from awarding authorities, and to pay no less than these rates to covered workers. The annual update requirement is not applicable to 27F "rental of equipment" contracts.
- Every contractor or subcontractor which performs construction work on the project is required to submit weekly payroll reports and a Statement of Compliance directly to the awarding authority by mail or email and keep them on file for three years. Each weekly payroll report must contain: the employee's name, address, occupational classification, hours worked, and wages paid. Do not submit weekly payroll reports to DLS.
