New Business

Shelby to contact computer repair/diagnostics volunteer. Geri suggested contacting Essex Vacuum repair, as they have expressed interest in the past. Tony to confirm 12 tables with Bridge at 211. Micaela to email committee members to volunteer.
- Nov 23 Textile Drive Vendor = Helpsy. In past, was helpful to have AmeriCorp volunteers. Micaela to look through Julie's list of contacts. Old Business

- Sept 14 Book Drive Feedback

 - Consider: changing the layout of drop-off and sorting tables, as well as utilization of tables (esp on shared tables)

 - Worth doing again ideally 2 volunteers
- Sept 22 Point Block Party Micaela's feedback (also volunteered: Cheryl Cripps, Dave Knowlton):
 - High contamination neighborhood, so it is good for us to do outreach there
 - Bean bag game noticed kids' "ah-ha" moments
 - Worth doing again ideally 2 volunteers each for 2 shifts, esp Spanish speaking volunteers
- Sept 28 Food Truck Festival Composting Feedback:
 - Positive experiences from initial partnership event:
 - 10+ large compost bins kept out of waste (Carol)
 - 10+ cardboard bins full of recycling (Carol)
 - Although unsure if remained separated from garbage and actually recycled
 - Many people had (+) feedback (Carol)
 - SHS students expressed interest in participating in future events (Carol)
 - Feedback to be provided to Conor (Nancy)
 - Wishes for future events:

- More/larger/better visibility signage and stations (Carol, Nancy)
- Adjust English/Spanish on signage (Nancy)
- Experienced volunteers to be paired with new ones (Nancy)
- Work with the city to require vendors to use only sustainable/compostable/recyclable products (Beth)
- Remind volunteers to bring own personal items (Melynn)
- Consider signage on vendor trucks (Melynn)
- Consider working with DPW to ensure trash and recycling bins are visibly different and stay separated (Melynn)
- Opportunity to partner more with Black Earth (Melynn)

- Mandatory Recycling / Hauler Ordinance meeting scheduled for Tuesday November 19, 2019 8:30am – 10am with RecycleWorks and Dave Greenbaum from the Health Department. This invite will be sent to all businesses, haulers and landlords for them to learn more about recycling and other waste diversion strategies as well as enforce the new ordinance.
