 - a. Request for Traffic Ordinance Recommendations
 - i. **Discussion and Recommendation: Brown Street and North Washington Square** – Staff will present language for a recommendation to the City Council for an order to make modest changes to the existing traffic pattern at the Roger Conant statue, based on conversations with the City Solicitor about the status and designation of the roads around the statue.
 - ii. **Discussion and Recommendation: Motorcoach Parking on Congress Street** – Staff will lead a discussion about relocating the motorcoach parking currently on the Congress Street bridge south towards Peabody Street to preserve the view corridor for South River and to add one (1) new motorcoach space to partially offset the loss of the spaces at Holyoke Square.
 - iii. **Discussion and Recommendation: Use of Skateboards on Streets and Sidewalks** – Based on the Commission’s discussion on this topic in April, staff will present an updated proposal for an ordinance change to allow the use of skateboards as a mode of transportation on City streets and sidewalks.
 - iv. **Discussion and Recommendation: Downtown Parking Rates** – Staff is seeking a recommendation from the Commission for changes to some downtown parking rates to support maintenance needs at the City’s parking facilities.
 - b. **Sewall Street Lot**– Staff will provide an update on the use of spaces in the Sewall Street lot for Health and Building Inspector Parking.
