    - i. Resident Sticker Parking Commission will continue its discussion from June 6, 2019. Per an order submitted by Councilor Madore and adopted by the City Council on May 9<sup>th</sup>, the Traffic and Parking Commission and Director have been asked to review the current ordinance (Ch. 42 Sec. 75, Traffic Parking Prohibitions Towing Zone (Resident Sticker)) and develop a set of recommendations to the Council to revise the current program with the intent of creating a more equitable system for all Salem residents and visitors.
