

We test your soil for biological and structural aspects, inspect your lawn, plants, and land configuration, etc. The other part is where you come in. Since you live with the space, we need your requests, ideas, and expectations, as well as your questions. Then, as certified land care experts, we can give our impressions of the property's condition and our suggestions for achieving what you want. We would also like to introduce you to some of the progressive concepts comprising Organic Land Care.

Offered with a fee to compile a property analysis for "Sustainable Organic Yard Health Care File" including a premeeting list of to do in advance of the meeting, answering all of the clients wants, needs, concerns, pointing out other areas of concern, and covering all the hardscape, and Softscapes, taking pictures, a soil test with analysis with recommendations documenting the property to show improvement, etc., this is a file just like when you go to your Doctors, or Dentist office where they have a health care record, then our information is compiled into electronic format have on file, and to send confidentially to the client! 
We expect runners to arrive at the Common starting at 8:15PM, with the last runner going through by 8:45PM.


