As you know, several years ago we worked with our collective bargaining units to institute a new policy to limit the practice of retirement sick-leave buybacks for new hires. However, for employees of these units hired prior to this agreement, they are still entitled to these payments under the terms of the collective bargaining agreement. While I value and applaud the work of our retiring employees and wish them well as they move into retirement, I continue to be adverse to the idea that employees should be compensated for not getting sick. I am glad we were able to work with our unions to change this benefit going forward, as this is a very costly matter for the City.







Ladies and Gentlemen of the City Council:

This letter is being submitted to notify you that we will not be filing a request to accommodate the October carnival this year. For the last eleven years, we have scheduled the carnival as an important part of our Haunted Happenings public safety operations, but after conversations with members of the City Council, it is now apparent that there are not sufficient votes to adjust the Ordinances prohibiting carnivals on either Riley Plaza or Salem Common – the two locations deemed most suitable for such an event by the Salem Police Department.

I am disappointed we will be removing this important tool from the Salem Police Department's toolkit for October. In 2006, the last year before we instituted the carnival, there were close to 40 arrests in October; in 2007, the first year of the carnival that number fell to 15 (for the last several years, arrests have been in single digits). Since that time, we have continued to improve our public safety response to October, not simply by adding more officers or resources, but using programmatic strategies including music stages, concluding fireworks, and the carnival. These assets helped make October more of a family-friendly event, changing the nature of the visitors who came to the city, especially later in the month. The carnival is more than an amusement and was an especially important component in providing youth between 13 and 20 with a constructive activity, in a well-lit and easily monitored location.

We will adjust public safety planning and resource allocation accordingly, of course, but the other impact of removing the carnival will be the reduction of \$20,000 to \$30,000 in additional revenues the carnival generated to help support public safety costs.

While a final proposal was not presented to the City Council until July, believe me the process of studying the suitability of over a dozen sites had commenced months earlier. Unfortunately, we were not able to coalesce around one site and generate support among a majority of councilors to move forward.

We will take the next month to regroup with Salem Police, NEMLEC, and our other public safety partners, in order to develop a plan for managing the October season without this resource in place.

Dear City Council,

On behalf of the Traffic and Parking Commission, included for consideration of the Salem City Council are five (5) recommended orders related to parking in October, all passed with unanimous recommendation by the Commission at its meeting on September 6, 2018.

Three of the orders are orders that have been passed by the Council in past years – the first adding some streets to the October resident permit parking area, the second making the City's MBTA Deport Lot and Church Street West lot free to Salem residents on weekends, and the third allowing Salem youth organizations to staff the parking lot at 297 Bridge Street (Universal Steel Lot) and collect parking fees on October weekends.

The fourth order formalizes a process that has happened more informally in recent years, and would allow the Acting Director of the Traffic and Parking Department to issue up to twenty-five (25) emergency parking permit for residents that do not live on a street that receives October resident parking privileges but have demonstrated some type of emergency need for parking close to their home (e.g. a woman who is pregnant during October and may need to get to the hospital quickly).

The final order is a new proposal to attempt to offer some parking relief to downtown Salem residents required to purchase parking passes in the South Harbor and Museum Place Garages. The passes these residents are required to purchase do not guarantee a parking space in the garage, so when the garages fill up during October, these residents are left with few, if any, parking options. The combination of high utilization of our other downtown parking assets and the temporary October resident parking restrictions leave these residents having to look much further afield from their home to park.

For these reasons, the Commission is recommending the accompanying order that would give these residents a parking pass for the month of October that would grant them parking privileges on any of the streets that receive temporary parking protection in October.

The Commission understands that there may be some concerns from Councillors and residents about issuing these additional passes. Altogether, there are less than 300 passes that would be issued, and residents receiving the passes would be instructed to first attempt to park first at the garage at which they purchase a pass. Then, if upon being told the garage is full, residents would proceed to try to find parking on one of the aforementioned streets. Not all 300 of these eligible car would be parking on these streets simultaneously, nor would all the cars be trying to park on just one of these streets. The Commission believes that by providing the broadest possible area in which to park, the effect on residents of those streets will be as minimal as possible, while still providing relief to these residents.

Background and notes: The MBTA Bus Service Planner for the Lynn District, which includes Salem, contacted Traffic and Parking Department staff re: a proposed bus stop relocation on Washington Street. The bus stop in question is located on the easterly side of Washington Street, north of the intersection with Federal Street. Currently, after embarking and/or disembarking passengers on the far right side of the road, the bus must cross multiple lanes of traffic to reach the far left lane to turn left onto Bridge Street and eventually right into the MBTA Station. This action can be difficult for the bus to perform, and as part of the Better Bus Project, the MBTA is trying to eliminate issues like this throughout its bus system. Eric Burkman form the MBTA presented to the Commission on August 2 two (2) alternative locations. The Commission discussed the merits of each, and proposed to move the bus stop south on Washington Street to the easterly side, north of the intersection with Church Street. Moving the bus stop to this location displaces three (3) metered parking spaces, and the Commission recommends those three (3) spaces be moved to the current bus stop location. City ordinances do not require Council action to create a bus stop within a metered parking zone, but to move the three lost metered spaces to the current bus stop location requires an extension of the metered parking area. Additionally, the Commission recommends the removal of two (2) bus stops currently in City ordinances that are not in use today.

On a motion duly made by Vice Chair Papetti and seconded by Commissioner Metsch, the Commission voted unanimously to recommend to Council the following:



Background and notes: The Traffic and Parking Department was approached by Councillors Turiel and Dibble re: a requested change to the parking restrictions on a section of Loring Avenue. The southeasterly side of the road between College Avenue and Linden Street is currently restricted to fifteen (15) minute parking or parking by permit issued by the Horace Mann Laboratory School. With the school having been moved, the Councillors agreed that this restriction should be lifted, and this section of road should be brought in line with other parking restrictions in and around Salem State University.

On a motion duly made by Officer Levesque and seconded by Commissioner Seidel, the Commission voted unanimously to recommend the following ordinance be passed by the City Council:

Background and notes: The Commission has discussed the issue of motorcoach parking throughout the downtown area at multiple meetings previously. Most recently, the Commission has considered the current motorcoach parking on the Congress Street bridge. There is a desire from the City to move the motorcoach parking somewhat off the bridge to prevent motorcoaches from blocking the view corridor. The existing spaces on the bridge are also painted as four (4) spaces, but with current motorcoach sizes can only accommodate three (3) motorcoaches. The Commission also has heard the need for additional motorcoach parking, shared with the Commission by Destination Salem. For these reasons, the Commission recommends the ordinance change below to shift the existing motorcoach parking on Congress Street south, to be adjacent with an existing MBTA bus stop, and the addition of a new motorcoach space on the easterly side of Congress Street.

On a motion duly made by Commission Metsch and second by Vice-Chair Papetti the Commission voted unanimously to recommend the following ordinance change to the City Council:





Pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 166, Sections 21, 22 and 25A, please find enclosed the petition (the "Petition") of New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC ("AT&T") for a grant of location for telecommunication wires and wireless attachments and appurtenances to be attached to existing utility poles owned by National Grid within the City of Salem. Included with the Petition are detailed plans that identify the locations where AT&T's proposed attachments will be placed. This includes an area map of all locations as well as the utility pole profiles depicting the equipment attachment heights and specs.

AT&T requests that the City schedule a public hearing on this Petition, subject to the requirements of Chapter 166 of the Massachusetts General Laws. It is my understanding that the City will be able to produce this list and I will work with the City Clerk to ensure the letters are sent per these requirements.

Project Description

AT&T proposes to deploy three (3) small cell sites in the City of Salem in order to deal with the rapidly increasing demand on AT&T's wireless network. All three (3) small cell sites will be mounted on existing National Grid utility poles located within the public rights of way. The small cell sites will work in conjunction with the existing macro sites installed on rooftops, towers and other structures in and around the City of Salem. This Petition specifically addresses the following location:

AT&T's radio frequency engineers targeted the proposed location due to the high traffic and data demands on AT&T's network. AT&T's radio frequency engineers targeted the proposed location due to the high traffic and data demands on AT&T's network. I have reviewed the request from AT&T for the installation of small cell attachments to existing telephone poles on Highland Avenue, Symonds Street and Liberty Hill Avenue. As part of the review for cell attachments, a determination must be made that the attachments will not impact the city's historic resources. Therefore, I have reviewed the submitted plans and offer the following comments:

Neither site is located in a local or National Register historic district. The proposed pole at 31 Symonds Street is located opposite an inventoried property at 30 Symonds Street (SAL.562). Due to the location of the pole adjacent to a parking area, Staff does not anticipate any impacts to the historic resource.



27 Liberty Hill Avenue:

The proposed pole on Liberty Hill Avenue is located at a highly visible intersection in a residential neighborhood across the street from Greenlawn Cemetery, which is listed in the National Register of Historic Places. Numerous properties in this neighborhood are included the City's historic resource inventory, including the property directly adjacent to the subject pole at 27 Liberty Hill Avenue (SAL.1752) as well as the adjoining property at 36 Appleton Street (SAL.1754). In addition, the proposed light pole already contains a street sign for Appleton Street, a veteran's marker for O'Neil Square and a stop sign. The location of new cell equipment on the pole at a height of 8 feet may impact this existing signage. The applicant's proposal does not include the existing signage on Drawing A-1 - Key Plan and Elevation for the new equipment making it difficult to determine any potential conflicts.

Based on the above findings, Staff recommends that an alternative pole be selected to minimize impacts on adjacent historic buildings and to be less visually conspicuous at this busy intersection. While it is typically not ideal to locate attachments on poles abutting the cemetery, there is an existing pole on the cemetery side of Liberty Hill Avenue that is already used for numerous attachments. (See Google street view image below.)

If an alternative location cannot be used, then the attachments to the pole should be placed as high as possible and on the least obtrusive side of the pole (which may be difficult due to pole's location on an intersection). Staff also recommends that attachments be painted if possible. The Historical Commission often requires property owners to paint vents and pipes in a matte finish to match color of building.

Pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 166, Sections 21, 22 and 25A, please find enclosed the petition (the "Petition") of New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC ("AT&T") for a grant of location for telecommunication wires and wireless attachments and appurtenances to be attached to existing utility poles owned by National Grid within the City of Salem. Included with the Petition are detailed plans that identify the locations where AT&T's proposed attachments will be placed. This includes an area map of all locations as well as the utility pole profiles depicting the equipment attachment heights and specs.

AT&T requests that the City schedule a public hearing on this Petition, subject to the requirements of Chapter 166 of the Massachusetts General Laws. Those requirements prescribe that the City mail "written notice of the time and place of the hearing at least seven days prior to all owners of real estate abutting upon that part of the way upon, along, across or under which the line is to be constructed, as such ownership is determined by the last preceding assessment for taxation". It is my understanding that the City will be able to produce this list and I will work with the City Clerk to ensure the letters are sent per these requirements.

Project Description

AT&T proposes to deploy three (3) small cell sites in the City of Salem in order to deal with the rapidly increasing demand on AT&T's wireless network. All three (3) small cell sites will be mounted on existing National Grid utility poles located within the public rights of way. The small cell sites will work in conjunction with the existing macro sites installed on rooftops, towers and other structures in and around the City of Salem. This Petition specifically addresses the following location:

27 Liberty Hill Ave, 42.531426 N,-70.905586W , Utility Pole: # 1062 Pole, Project: cRAN_Area 4_0092A

AT&T's radio frequency engineers targeted the proposed location due to the high traffic and data demands on AT&T's network. AT&T's existing macro cell sites are not providing adequate data capacity in this location due to increased population, vehicular and foot traffic, multiple wireless devices used by each person and other contributing factors. This small cell site will work to offload the demand on the macro sites and allow for increased data capacity and speed within the immediate vicinity of the proposed small cell site.

The small cell site will be installed using standard commercially accepted methods in accordance with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations. All proposed attachments are to existing poles owned and maintained by National Grid. AT&T has entered into a Pole Attachment Agreement with National Grid.
