ARTICLE XI: MEAL PERIODS

All employees who work at least (6) hours per day shall be granted a meal period of thirty (30) minutes during each work shift. Whenever possible the meal period shall be scheduled at the middle of the shift.

ARTICLE XII: SICK LEAVE

- A. Sick leave shall be granted for personal sickness and for up to five days for sickness or injury in the immediate family. Immediate family is defined as set forth in Part One, Section A of Article XV11, entitled Funeral Leave. As such, Immediate family shall mean: Spouse, Mother, Father, Brother, Sister, Children, Grandparents, Grandchildren, Mother or Father-in-law, or any other dependent living in the household.
- B. For absence due to illness in excess of (5) consecutive working days the Employer may require, for purposes of additional evidence, a certificate from a physician.
- C. The parties recognize and agree to adhere to the Absence Control Policy as adopted by the City, excepting for the requirement of a certificate from a physician, which is governed by paragraph B above.
- D. Employees absent because of an industrial accident may, if they so desire, draw from their sick leave credits, to make up the difference between the payment of compensation and their full week's pay.
- E.1 On retirement or death of and employee who was employed on or before July 1, 2000 payment for accumulated unused sick leave will be made to the employee or his/her estate, up to a maximum of ninety (90) days.
- E.2 On retirement or death of an employee who was employed on or after July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2002, payment for accumulated unused sick leave will be made to the employee or his/her estate, up to a maximum of forty-five (45) days.
- E.3 Effective upon the execution of the 2011-2014 Agreement the District agrees to offer the following two options regarding Sick Leave Buyback to members on a voluntary basis.

Option A - Members with a Service Date of 1/1/2003 or earlier.

Upon written request by the member, the District agrees to provide the member with a one-time payment for fifty percent of the member's accrued sick leave, at the rate of one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) per day. The maximum number of days a member may receive payment for cannot exceed forty-five (45) days. Upon retirement from the District, any member who has received payment from the District in accordance with this Section will have his or her sick leave buyback in accordance with Section E. paragraphs 1 & 2 reduced by the number of days he or she has received hereunder. The member has the option to request the District deposit this one-time payment in the member's preferred deferred compensation plan.

Option B - Members with a Service Date of 1/2/2003-12/31/2012

Upon written request by the member, the District agrees to provide the member with a one-time payment for fifty percent of the member's accrued sick leave, at the rate of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day. The maximum number of days a member may receive payment for cannot exceed forty-five (45) days. Upon retirement from the District, any member who has received payment from the District in accordance with this provision will have his or her sick leave buyback in accordance with Section E. paragraphs 1 & 2 reduced by the number of days he or she received in accordance with this provision. The member has the option to request the District deposit this one-time payment in the member's preferred deferred compensation plan.

E. 4 Members hired on or after January 1, 2013 shall not be entitled to a buyback of sick days at retirement, but in the alternative, will be eligible to buy back, at the employee's daily rate, not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) per day, up to two sick days per year. Payment shall be made in January following the end of the calendar year in which the employee had not used fifty percent (50%) of his or her sick leave accrual in the prior calendar year. The funds paid out shall be paid into a deferred compensation plan.

ARTICLE XI: MEAL PERIODS

All employees who work at least (6) hours per day shall be granted a meal period of thirty (30) minutes during each work shift. Whenever possible the meal period shall be scheduled at the middle of the shift.

ARTICLE XII: SICK LEAVE

- A. Sick leave shall be granted for personal sickness and for up to five days for sickness or injury in the immediate family. Immediate family is defined as set forth in Part One, Section A of Article XV11, entitled Funeral Leave. As such, Immediate family shall mean: Spouse, Mother, Father, Brother, Sister, Children, Grandparents, Grandchildren, Mother or Father-in-law, or any other dependent living in the household.
- B. For absence due to illness in excess of (5) consecutive working days the Employer may require, for purposes of additional evidence, a certificate from a physician.
- C. The parties recognize and agree to adhere to the Absence Control Policy as adopted by the City, excepting for the requirement of a certificate from a physician, which is governed by paragraph B above.
- D. Employees absent because of an industrial accident may, if they so desire, draw from their sick leave credits, to make up the difference between the payment of compensation and their full week's pay.
- E.1 On retirement or death of and employee who was employed on or before July 1, 2000 payment for accumulated unused sick leave will be made to the employee or his/her estate, up to a maximum of ninety (90) days.
- E.2 On retirement or death of an employee who was employed on or after July 1, 2000 through June 30, 2002, payment for accumulated unused sick leave will be made to the employee or his/her estate, up to a maximum of forty-five (45) days.
- E.3 Effective upon the execution of the 2011-2014 Agreement the District agrees to offer the following two options regarding Sick Leave Buyback to members on a voluntary basis.

Option A - Members with a Service Date of 1/1/2003 or earlier.

Upon written request by the member, the District agrees to provide the member with a one-time payment for fifty percent of the member's accrued sick leave, at the rate of one hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) per day. The maximum number of days a member may receive payment for cannot exceed forty-five (45) days. Upon retirement from the District, any member who has received payment from the District in accordance with this Section will have his or her sick leave buyback in accordance with Section E. paragraphs 1 & 2 reduced by the number of days he or she has received hereunder. The member has the option to request the District deposit this one-time payment in the member's preferred deferred compensation plan.

Option B – Members with a Service Date of 1/2/2003- 12/31/2012

Upon written request by the member, the District agrees to provide the member with a one-time payment for fifty percent of the member's accrued sick leave, at the rate of fifty dollars (\$50.00) per day. The maximum number of days a member may receive payment for cannot exceed forty-five (45) days. Upon retirement from the District, any member who has received payment from the District in accordance with this provision will have his or her sick leave buyback in accordance with Section E. paragraphs 1 & 2 reduced by the number of days he or she received in accordance with this provision. The member has the option to request the District deposit this one-time payment in the member's preferred deferred compensation plan.

E. 4 Members hired on or after January 1, 2013 shall not be entitled to a buyback of sick days at retirement, but in the alternative, will be eligible to buy back, at the employee's daily rate, not to exceed two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) per day, up to two sick days per year. Payment shall be made in January following the end of the calendar year in which the employee had not used fifty percent (50%) of his or her sick leave accrual in the prior calendar year. The funds paid out shall be paid into a deferred compensation plan.

ARTICLE XIII: PERSONNEL POLICIES

The parties shall memorialize these leadership stipends annually for MTRS purposes.

- a. Head Teachers for Physical Education, Fine and Performing Arts, and World Languages, as well as the Music Coordinator, will be responsible for participating in the delivery of four (4) 2-hour PD sessions during release days for K-12 teachers. For this responsibility, their annual head teacher stipend will be increased to four thousand five hundred (\$4,500.00).
- 3. Stipends for Bilingualism/Biliteracy: Active employees and new employees who are certified or deemed to be bilingual/biliterate via employer approved certification process and/or test shall receive an annual stipend of one thousand dollar (\$1,000.00). The expectation is that employees that receive this stipend will support building-based and district wide multilingual communication needs.

O. Methods of Salary Payment

Salaries shall be paid in twenty-six equal installments beginning on the Friday nearest to September 15 and continuing on every other Friday thereafter. Personnel desiring a lump-sum payment of money at the end of June may receive all accumulated monies by notifying the Superintendent by May 1.

Members of the Bargaining Unit may choose to receive their salaries in twenty-one equal paychecks. Personnel selecting such option must do so by September 1 in any year. Said election shall remain in effect for the remainder of the year and from year to year thereafter unless notice is made as set forth above.

Yearlong stipends shall be paid in two (2) installments during the months of December and June, if possible in a separate check from the bi-weekly payroll check. Seasonal stipends shall be paid, during the month of December for fall activities and during the month of June for winter and spring activities, if possible in a separate check from the bi-weekly payroll check.

P. Severance Pay/Sick Leave Buyback

1. Severance Pay: On the retirement or death of a teacher who has been continuously employed prior to September 1, 2000, payment for accumulated sick leave will be made to the teacher or his/her estate up to a total of eighty (80) days. On the retirement or death of a teacher who has been employed on or after September 1, 2000, payment for accumulated sick leave will be made to the teacher or his/her estate up to a total of forty (40) days. Effective January 1, 2013, employees hired on or after this date shall not be eligible for any severance pay as described above.

To be eligible for this payment, retiring teachers must provide the Superintendent with sixty (60) days advance notice of said retirement, except in emergency situations. For the purpose of this section, the word "retirement" is defined as being an employee who is eligible for and receiving benefits in accordance with the rules and regulations of the

Acting Mayor McCarthy is pleased to report through David Kucharsky, Director of Traffic and Parking, that the City of Salem has been awarded a set of combination radar feedback equipment and school zone speed limit sign assemblies. This MOA was signed on Tuesday, March 21, 2023 and will follow next steps with the legal department to ensure all matters are finalized appropriately.

The MassDOT indicates that the speed-calming assemblies are offered in response to an increase in speed-related traffic deaths and injuries in Massachusetts, as well as a recent revision to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices that now defines school zones to include grades 9 through 12. Up to 50 municipalities were chosen, including Salem, to receive two assemblies to support one school zone area, with awardees selected based on need, context, environment, risks and crash history.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

This Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA") is made and entered into this day of March 2023 by and between the Massachusetts Department of Transportation, having offices at 10 Park
Plaza, Boston, Massachusetts 02116 ("MassDOT"), and the City/Town of, and, and, and, and
("Municipality"). MassDOT and the Municipality may hereafter be collectively referred to herein as the "Parties" and individually as the "Party."

WHEREAS, MassDOT administers a Federal-Aid grant program that provides Combination Dynamic Speed Feedback and School Zone Speed Sign assemblies ("Speed Feedback Signs" or "Sign Assemblies") to municipalities for installation in existing municipal school zones to enhance roadway user safety; and

WHEREAS, Municipality has proposed to install Speed Feedback Signs provided by MassDOT at the School(s) in the existing municipal school zone (s) described in Exhibit A, attached hereto, (the "Locations") in its approved Combination Dynamic Speed Feeback and School Zone Speed Sign Assembly Grant Application; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Locations are within the public right of way in a municipal school zone that conforms with the requirements of Sections 7A.01 and 7A.05 of the 2022 Massachusetts Amendments to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices; and

WHEREAS, Municipality has agreed to install the proposed Speed Feedback Signs at the Locations in accordance with the terms provided herein (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, MassDOT and Municipality seek to confirm their respective rights and obligations in connection with the Project as set forth in this MOA.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the obligations contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, MassDOT and the Municipality hereby agree, each with the other, as follows:

 Speed Feedback Signs. MassDOT will provide Municipality with the Speed Feedback Signs described in <u>Exhibit B</u>, attached hereto. MassDOT will fund the entire cost of the Sign Assemblies, including the cost of delivery to Municipality. Title to the Signs will pass to Municipality upon delivery.

It is understood and agreed that MassDOT's procurement of the Speed Feedback Signs is contingent upon availability and continued appropriation of federal funds, and if for any reason whatsoever, such funds are terminated or reduced or otherwise become unavailable, MassDOT may terminate this MOA in whole or in part immediately.

2. Installation. Municipality, at its sole expense, shall install the Speed Feedback Signs at the aforementioned Location(s). Aside from the Sign Assemblies provided by MassDOT, Municipality shall provide all necessary labor, materials, equipment, and other services necessary to install the Speed Feedback Signs in accordance with vendor specifications. Municipality shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules and regulations applicable to the installation of the Sign Assemblies.

Municipality shall install each Speed Feedback Sign in conformance with the requirements of Sections 7B.09 and 2A.19 of the 2009 *Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD)*. Prior to installation, Municipality personnel and/or contractors shall attend a training conducted by MassDOT and/or its vendor, free of charge, at a MassDOT District Office to be designated.

Municipality shall also obtain, at its sole cost and expense, any and all applicable permits, approvals, including local approvals, and/or clearances required by local and state agencies, commissions, or bodies necessary for the completion of the Project prior to installing the Speed Feedback Signs. This includes, but is not limited to, any applicable MassDOT Access Permits to enter upon the State Highway. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed to as permission for Municipality and/or its contractors to enter upon the State Highway for the performance of any activities in connection with the Project, including but not limited to, Municipality's installation, maintenance, repair, and operation obligations as set forth herein, without first obtaining any and all applicable permits.

Municipality shall install each Sign Assembly within ninety (90) days of its delivery to Municipality. If Municipality cannot complete the installation within the ninety-day period, it may request an extension. Any request for an extension must be made in writing to MassDOT soon as practicably possible, but not later than sixty (60) days after Municipality's receipt of the Sign Assemblies. Municipality's request shall include a justification for the requested extension, the anticipated installation date, and any other information deemed necessary by MassDOT. MassDOT, in its sole and exclusive discretion, may agree to grant said request for an extension of time if it finds that sufficient justification has been provided by the Municipality.

Within a week of installing each Sign Assembly, Municipality shall provide to MassDOT both the latitude and longitude (in decimal degrees (DD) format: e.g. 34.11914, -118.30036) of the installed assembly unit and the serial number or other unique identification number of the unit. This unit identification information must be included when delivering the collected data from each unit pursuant to Section 4 of this MOA.

Within six (6) months of the installation of the Speed Feedback Signs, Municipality shall

provide a brief written report to MassDOT describing Municipality's experiences [training, installation, data collection, associated costs (including without limitation time spent) and benefits and any unintended consequences both positive and negative]. This report is separate from the data reporting requirements in Section 4.

3. Operation and Maintenance. Municipality, at its sole cost, shall be solely responsible for the operation, maintenance, repair, and disposal at the end of service life, and other handling of the Speed Feedback Signs. The Speed Feedback Signs shall be designated, located, and operated in accordance with the Standards of MassDOT for such devices. The Police Department of Municipality shall be the enforcement agency for traffic regulations established in accordance with the with this MOA and the Speed Feedback Signs installed in connection therewith.

Municipality, in accordance with the provisions of Sections 109(d) and 116 of Title 23 USC, shall properly maintain the way and all Speed Feedback Signs and under the control of Municipality within the Project area. This obligation includes features of facilities and equipment that are required to be readily accessible to and usable by persons with disabilities. This requirement does not prohibit isolated or temporary interruptions in service or access due to maintenance or repairs. Municipality's obligations under this Section 3 shall survive the expiration of this MOA.

- 4. **Data**. Municipality shall electronically deliver to MassDOT all data gathered from the Signs (1) during the first thirty (30) day period immediately following the Signs' installation and (2) at any other such time as may be requested by MassDOT until January 1, 2026. Such data will be delivered to MassDOT in a form and manner acceptable to MassDOT (including without limitation in accordance with any information security protocols designated by MassDOT, if applicable). Municipality's obligations under this Section 4 shall survive the expiration of this MOA.
- 5. Term. This MOA shall be effective as of the date of full execution by Municipality and MassDOT and, unless terminated earlier as provided herein or otherwise agreed in writing by the Parties, shall remain in full force and effect for a period of two (2) years after Municipality's receipt of the Sign Assemblies. This MOA may be terminated by mutual agreement of the Parties, upon such terms and conditions as the Parties may mutually agree upon. Such termination shall be effective in accordance with a written agreement by the Parties.

In addition, MassDOT may, by written notice to Municipality, terminate this MOA in any one of the following circumstances:

(a) The Municipality neglects or fails to comply with any provision of this MOA in

accordance with its terms or within the time specified for performance herein, and Municipality fails to cure any such failure within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of notice specifying such failure. In the event this MOA is terminated pursuant to this provision, MassDOT shall not be liable to the Municipality for any costs incurred or burdens assumed upon or subsequent to, and associated with, such termination.

(b) The applicable Federal funding source fails to appropriate or otherwise make available funds for the Signs. In the event this Agreement is terminated pursuant to this provision, MassDOT shall not be liable to Municipality for any costs.

In the event that MassDOT terminates this MOA subsequent to the delivery of the Sign Assembly to Municipality but prior to its installation, Municipality shall, at its expense, return the Sign Assembly to the applicable MassDOT District Office.

- 6. Compliance with Laws. Municipality, in meeting its obligations hereunder, shall comply with all applicable federal, state, county, municipal and other governmental statues, laws, rules, orders, regulations and ordinances. Municipality's obligations under this Section 6 shall survive the expiration of this MOA.
- 7. **Indemnification**. To the extent permitted by the laws of the Commonwealth, Municipality shall indemnify, defend (at Municipality's sole expense and with counsel reasonably acceptable to MassDOT), and hold harmless MassDOT and all of MassDOT's officers, agents, and employees, from and against any and all suits, claims, proceedings, liabilities, losses damages, penalties, charges and expenses (including attorneys' fees and experts' fees) of every name and nature, based on or arising out of any actual or alleged loss or injury (including death) to persons or damage to real or tangible property that are caused or alleged to be caused, in whole or in part, by, or to arise out of the acts or omissions of, Municipality, or its employees, contractors, subcontractors, or agents, in its performance of the obligations set forth herein. Municipality's obligations under this Section 7 shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this MOA.
- 8. **Notices:** Any notices required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be given in writing and shall be delivered (a) in person, (b) by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, or (c) by a commercial overnight courier that guarantees next day delivery and provides a receipt. Such notices shall be addressed as follows:

or to such other address as either Party may from time to time specify in writing to the other Party. Any notice shall be effective only upon delivery.

- 9. **Authority**. The individuals executing this MOA represent that they are empowered and duly authorized to so execute this MOA on behalf of the Parties they represent.
- 10. **Miscellaneous**. This MOA represents the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, superseding any prior oral or written agreements or understandings regarding the same, and any modification amendment or change to the terms and conditions hereof shall be binding only when expressed in writing and signed by both Parties hereto. This MOA may be signed in multiple counterparts each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which when taken together shall constitute one and the same instrument. This MOA shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, without regard to its choice of law rules. If any provision or condition of this MOA shall be deemed invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions and conditions shall remain in full force and effect and shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by law.

Salem Main Streets respectfully requests permission to close Front Street as well as Essex Street from New Liberty Street to Hawthorne Boulevard to vehicular traffic during the Salem Arts Festival on Saturday, June 3 and Sunday, June 4 from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. We also ask to close the Front Street parking lot and Houdini Way between Front Street and the Klop Alley parking lot for safety and programming purposes. The Salem Arts Festival, a Salem Main Streets project in partnership with the Creative Collective, is a free, family-friendly festival celebrating the arts and includes an art show in Old Town Hall, a street fair, live performances, and collaborative art-making activities.

The majority of our activities will take place in Derby Square, Front Street, and Artists' Row, with a new acoustic stage at Armory Park (with permission from the Peabody Essex Museum) and additional artisan vendors on Essex Street. Closing the streets allows us to increase performance activity and street fair vendors without worrying about crowds crossing the street safely (with good weather, we can see 8,000+ visitors over the course of the weekend). It also typically increases foot traffic to the storefronts along the road closures.

We will be reaching out to Front Street businesses in April to discuss ways to ensure that the increased foot traffic from the festival continues benefitting them as intended, as well as communication to impacted residents. As this is the first year we have considered closing this stretch of Essex Street, we plan to be in contact with all abutters in advance of the council meeting on March 23.

If our proposal is approved, we will again work with the Police and Fire departments to implement any security measures that they recommend. We will be sure to secure the appropriate approvals from Licensing for the festival weekend.
