The FY2023 budget included a salary/collective bargaining reserve (account 11521-5171A), from which I am requesting to transfer to the Human Resources Retroactive Wages Account (11521-5161) to fund the FY23 retroactive contractual pay increases for SLA and to the Library Full-Time Salaries account to fund ongoing FY23 payroll costs associated with the agreement.

Separately, I am requesting transfers from salary/collective bargaining reserve (account 11521-5171A) into the Retroactive Wages Account (11521-5161) to fund contractually agreed to one-time payments for members of the SPPA.

Lastly, I am requesting transfers from Free Cash into the Retroactive Wages Account (11521-5161) to fund FY22 and FY23 retroactive payments SPPA and into the Police Department Full-Time Salaries account to fund the ongoing pay costs associated with the agreement.

Totals requested for each are as follows:

- 1) A total of \$31,084.44 representing FY23 retroactive payments (\$17,933.33) for SLA funded from the salary/collective bargaining reserve and to be transferred to the retroactive wages account and ongoing FY23 costs (\$13,151.11) also funded from the salary/collective bargaining reserve and to be transferred to Library Full-Time Salaries account to fund pay increases pursuant to the contract settlement effective 7/1/2022;
- 2) One-time payments totaling \$108,000 to be transferred from the salary/collective bargaining reserve to the retroactive wages account for SPPA pursuant to contract settlements effective 7/1/2021; and,

3) A total of \$683,533.04, representing the following: FY22 retroactive payments to SPPA totaling \$154,743.14 to be transferred from Free Cash to the retroactive wages account, FY23 retroactive payments to SPPA totaling \$149,235.81 to be transferred from Free Cash to the retroactive wages account, and ongoing FY23 costs SPPA totaling \$379,554.10 to be transferred from Free Cash to the Police Department's Full-Time salaries account.

Dear Honorable Mayor McCarthy:

Enclosed herewith is a request to transfer a total of \$62,084.42 from the Human Resources Department's "Salary/CB Reserve Account" (11521-5171A) to various department personnel accounts for costs associated with the January 1, 2023 minimum wage increase, the most recent AFSCME Council 93, AFL-CIO, Local 1818 contract, staffing associated with the September and November elections, and other recommended salary and personnel-line adjustments.

As part of our annual "mid-year review" of departmental line-items, we identified one line that was not adjusted in the FY2023 budget process to afford the minimum wage increase as of January 1, 2023. The associated cost for this is \$250. Separately, the latest AFSCME agreement was finalized after the FY2023 budget was submitted, so the annualized costs of the salary adjustments were not included in the budget at that time. Most departments have been able to absorb the costs due to turnover savings; however, \$6,520.60 is needed to cover the remaining costs. Additionally, the City Clerk's Office has reported overages from the September and November elections for poll workers and overtime. The total cost for the overages is \$28,213.19. Separately, after the FY2023 budget was finalized, a \$4,000 stipend was restored in the City Council personnel line, as well as a salary adjustment necessitating an additional funding level of \$1,003.85 in the associated City Clerk line-item. Additionally, \$5,543.34 is needed to cover staffing transition costs in the Mayor's Office and \$16,453.44 is requested to fund retention adjustments at various departments signed-off by the previous administration and ready to be implemented (that cannot otherwise be absorbed within existing departmental personnel funding levels).

The current balance of the HR-Salary Reserve is \$250,000; thus, this requested transfer from the reserve to departmental lines is afforded within existing FY2023 appropriations and does not require any additional funds.

Ordered: That the Committee on Ordinances, Licenses and Legal Affairs co-posted with the Committee of the Whole meet to discuss the following Home Rule Petition:

That a petition to the General Court, accompanied by a bill for authorization to enact a local condominium conversion ordinance for the purposes of tenant stability and maintaining the general welfare of Salem residents, as set forth below, be filed with an attested copy of this Order be, and hereby is approved to the end that the following legislation be adopted, except for amendments by the Senate or House of Representatives which conform to the intent of this home rule petition:

AN ACT authorizing the City of Salem to enact a condominium conversion ordinance for buildings containing two or more residential units.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court Assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

AN ACT RELATIVE TO A CONDOMINIMUM CONVERSION ORDINANCE IN THE CITY OF SALEM.

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law to the contrary, the City of Salem City Council by majority vote may enact an ordinance to regulate the conversion of housing accommodations in the municipality to the condominium or cooperative form or ownership in buildings containing two or more residential units.

SECTION 2. Such ordinance may include, but is not limited to: (i) provisions for investigations and hearings on condominium conversions or proposed conversions; (ii) a permit process; (iii) tenant notification requirements; (iv) relocation costs for tenants and other measures to protect tenants; (v) control of evictions; (vi) penalties for violation of the ordinance; and (vii) afford tenants and the City or the City's Designee the right to purchase the residential property in which the tenant(s) reside(s) when the residential property is being offered for sale.

SECTION 3. The ordinance may establish a condominium review board or vest administrative duties in an existing municipal board, commission, or office. The review board may exercise such powers as it is given by the ordinance.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.


