Enclosed is an Order authorizing submission of the City's *Application for Federal Assistance* to the U. S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for the period of July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024. For HUD program year 2023 (Fiscal Year 2024), Salem's estimated CDBG entitlement is \$1,059,113.00. In 2020, the City completed its 5-Year Consolidated Plan, outlining Salem's housing, economic and community development needs and funding priorities. In order to receive Federal funds, the City is required to develop Annual Action Plans which put into action the goals and strategies established in the Consolidated Plan.

For the FY24 Action Plan, the process began with a virtual public hearing which held on January 19, 2023, along with the issuance of a request for funding proposals from agencies to provide housing, economic development and public service programs, and from municipal departments for infrastructure and public facilities improvements. The Draft FY24 Action Plan describes the proposed activities to be undertaken during the upcoming fiscal year. A link to the plan was emailed to you on March 27, 2023. As part of the formal public review process, a 30-day public comment period commenced on March 30th and a remote public hearing is scheduled for April 20<sup>th</sup>.

## DIVISION 14. AFFORDABLE HOUSING TRUST FUND BOARD OF TRUSTEES1

#### Sec. 2-1000. Established.

The affordable housing trust fund board of trustees is established.

(Ord. of 10-26-2006, § 1)

#### Sec. 2-1001. Composition.

The affordable housing trust fund board of trustees shall be composed of <u>12.8</u> trustees, including the mayor and two members of the city council.

(Ord. of 10-26-2006, § 1)

#### Sec. 2-1002. Appointment of trustees; term; vacancies.

The mayor shall serve as a trustee and appoint annually in January, subject to confirmation by the city council, four trustees who shall serve for a term of one year and appoint biennially, subject to confirmation by the city council, four trustees who shall serve for a term of two years. The city council shall annually elect two members of the city council to serve for a term of one year. The city council president or the city council president or the city council president's designee shall serve for a term of one year. No trustee, excluding the mayor, shall serve for a term exceeding two years. If a vacancy shall occur among the trustees, it shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment for the unexpired term.

(Ord. of 10-26-2006, § 1; Ord. of 5-13-2021, § I)

#### Sec. 2-1003. Compensation.

The trustees shall serve without compensation.

(Ord. of 10-26-2006, § 1)

#### Sec. 2-1004. Removal.

Trustees may be removed by a majority vote of the city council, subject to approval of the mayor. (Ord. of 10-26-2006, § 1)

<sup>1</sup>State law reference(s)—M.G.L.A. c. 44, § 55C.

#### Sec. 2-1005. Powers and duties.

The trustees shall administer an affordable housing trust fund to provide for the creation and preservation of affordable housing within the City of Salem for the benefit of low to moderate income households.

The specific powers and duties of the trustees, all of which shall be carried on in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this division, are as follows:

- (1) To accept and receive property, whether real or personal, by gift, grant, devise, or transfer from any person, firm, corporation or other public or private entity, including without limitation grants of funds or other property tendered to the trust in connection with provisions of any zoning ordinance or bylaw or any other ordinance or by-law;
- (2) To purchase and retain real or personal property, including without restriction investments that yield a high rate of income or no income;
- (3) To sell, lease, exchange, transfer or convey any personal, mixed, or real property at public auction or by private contract for such consideration and on such terms as to credit or otherwise, and to make such contracts and enter into such undertaking relative to trust property as the board deems advisable notwithstanding the length of any such lease or contract;
- (4) To execute, acknowledge and deliver deeds, assignments, transfers, pledges, leases, covenants, contracts, promissory notes, releases and other instruments sealed or unsealed, necessary, proper or incident to any transaction in which the board engages for the accomplishment of the purposes of the trust;
- (5) To employ advisors and agents, such as accountants, appraisers and lawyers as the board deems necessary;
- (6) To pay reasonable compensation and expenses to all advisors and agents and to apportion such compensation between income and principal as the board deems advisable;
- (7) To apportion receipts and charges between incomes and principal as the board deems advisable, to amortize premiums and establish sinking funds for such purpose, and to create reserves for depreciation depletion or otherwise;
- (8) To participate in any reorganization, recapitalization, merger or similar transactions; and to give proxies or powers of attorney with or without power of substitution to vote any securities or certificates of interest; and to consent to any contract, lease, mortgage, purchase or sale of property, by or between any corporation and any other corporation or person;
- (9) To deposit any security with any protective reorganization committee, and to delegate to such committee such powers and authority with relation thereto as the board may deem proper and to pay, out of trust property, such portion of expenses and compensation of such committee as the board may deem necessary and appropriate;
- (10) To carry property for accounting purposes other than acquisition date values;
- (11) To borrow money on such terms and conditions and from such sources as the board deems advisable, to mortgage and pledge trust assets as collateral;
- (12) To make distributions or divisions of principal in kind;
- (13) To comprise, attribute, defend, enforce, release, settle or otherwise adjust claims in favor or against the trust, including claims for taxes, and to accept any property, either in total or partial satisfaction of any indebtedness or other obligation, and subject to the provisions of this act, to continue to hold the same for such period of time as the board may deem appropriate;

- (14) To manage or improve real property; and to abandon any property which the board determined not to be worth retaining;
- (15) To hold all or part of the trust property uninvested for such purposes and for such time as the board may deem appropriate; and
- (16) To extend the time for payment of any obligation to the trust.
- (17) To study, evaluate, and recommend policies, programs, practices, ordinances, and similar measures to increase and maintain the availability of affordable and workforce housing in the City of Salem.

The powers and duties enumerated above are intended to encompass all powers and duties of the trustees. Any action, power or duty not enumerated above shall require prior approval of the city council.

#### Sec. 2-1006. Records; annual report.

The trustees shall keep a record of its doings and at the close of every fiscal year make a report thereof to the city council. The report shall include a description and source of funds received and expended and the type of affordable housing programs or properties assisted with the funding. The trustees shall also provide the city council with a copy of the trust's annual audit.

1. On behalf of the family, the Salem Veterans Council and the Director of Veteran Services, Kim F. Emerling, fully endorse the naming of the below city square in honor of a Salem veteran who lost his life in the service of his country during WWII.

<u>Pelletier Square:</u> to be located at the corner of Cabot and Gardner Streets in Ward 5. US Army Private Rene "Pete" Pelletier resided at 22 Cabot Street prior to his enlistment. After induction on 21 September 1942, Pelletier trained as an Infantryman before attending the United States Parachute School at Ft. Benning, GA. He went on to be assigned to the relatively new 504<sup>th</sup> Parachute Regiment that was later attached to the 82<sup>nd</sup> Airborne Division. On 3 February 1945, during the Battle of the Bulge around the town of Bastogne, Private Pelletier was killed in action, two months before Victory in Europe (VE) Day on 5 May 1945. Private Pelletier is interred at Henri-Chapelle American Cemetery in Hombourg, Belgium.

- 2. This veteran meets the eligibility criteria of having been a resident of the City of Salem upon entry into the Armed Forces and having made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of our freedoms and our American way of life. It is requested that this endorsement be given favorable consideration by the City Council.
- 3. We expect to dedicate this square on Memorial Day 2023 with his many family members, fellow veterans, and the Salem community.

Notwithstanding Chapter 2 of the Massachusetts Acts of 2023 allowing public bodies to continue holding public meetings remotely until March 31, 2025, the City Council and its Standing Committees shall meet in person. In person shall be the primary method of public access to such meetings. A secondary method of public access may be provided, if technologically feasible, though Salem Access Television and/or remotely through technological means such as Zoom.

A quorum of members must be present in person unless a meeting is posted noting that the meeting will be held as a hybrid meeting, meaning both in person and remotely and enabling a quorum to include members present in Council Chambers and remotely. A hybrid meeting may only be held if members of the public can observe and listen to the meeting, or if it is a public hearing, they are able to provide public comment remotely.

All meeting notices shall indicate clearly whether or not the primary method of public access is in person, in person with a secondary public access via remote participation, or hybrid where the in-person and remote access must both be available. If applicable, the meeting notice shall indicate how members of the public may access the meeting remotely including the relevant links, URLs, access codes, PINs, meeting ID numbers, or telephone numbers.

This Order supersedes the Remote Participation Policy adopted by the City Council on March 24, 2022.

#### CHAPTER 268A. CONDUCT OF PUBLIC OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES

# Chapter 268A: Section 20. Municipal employees; financial interest in contracts; holding one or more elected positions

Section 20. (a) A municipal employee who has a financial interest, directly or indirectly, in a contract made by a municipal agency of the same city or town, in which the city or town is an interested party of which financial interest he has knowledge or has reason to know, shall be punished by a fine of not more than three thousand dollars or by imprisonment for not more than two years, or both.

This section shall not apply if such financial interest consists of the ownership of less than one per cent of the stock of a corporation.

This section shall not apply (a) to a municipal employee who in good faith and within thirty days after he learns of an actual or prospective violation of this section makes full disclosure of his financial interest to the contracting agency and terminates or disposes of the interest, or (b) to a municipal employee who is not employed by the contracting agency or an agency which regulates the activities of the contracting agency and who does not participate in or have official responsibility for any of the activities of the contracting agency, if the contract is made after public notice or where applicable, through competitive bidding, and if the municipal employee files with the clerk of the city or town a statement making full disclosure of his interest and the interest of his immediate family, and if in the case of a contract for personal services (1) the services will be provided outside the normal working hours of the municipal employee, (2) the services are not required as part of the municipal employee's regular duties, the employee is compensated for not more than five hundred hours during a calendar year, (3) the head of the contracting agency makes and files with the clerk of the city or town a written certification that no employee of that agency is available to perform those services as part of their regular duties, and (4) the city council, board of selectmen or board of aldermen approve the exemption of his interest from this section.







Appendix A - Rules and Orders of the City Council, Sec. 26C. Rules for Testimony During "Public Testimony" portion of Regular Meetings is hereby amended by deleting this section in its entirety and replacing it with the following:

"Sec. 26C. Rules for Testimony During "Public Testimony" portion of Regular Meetings The following rules shall be observed during the "Public Testimony" portion of Regular Meetings of the City Council:

- 1.. In order to manage Public Testimony in a reasonable amount of time, before opening the Public Testimony portion of the meeting, the President shall, depending on the number of speakers, set a time limit, not to exceed three minutes, which each individual presenting testimony must abide. The Public Testimony portion of the meeting shall not exceed fifteen (15) minutes, extended at the discretion of the President or to a time definite by majority vote of the Council.
- 2. Anyone wishing to present testimony at a City Council meeting must sign-up online or sign a roster in the Clerk's office up to 30 minutes prior to the start of the meeting. The roster (s) shall be presented to the President of the City Council at the start of the Regular Meeting. Only those individuals whose names appear on the roster may present testimony at the meeting in question.
- 3. Public testimony shall be conducted in an orderly and peaceable manner. Failure to do so may result in the President terminating the speaker's comment period.
- 4. The Public Comment period is not a public hearing or a question and answer period."
