Ladies and Gentlemen of the City Council:

I am pleased to appoint Captain Fred Ryan of 95 Margin Street to the Salem Harbor Port Authority for a three-year term to expire November 17, 2025. Captain Ryan will fill the seat previously held by Michael Rutstein. Please join me in thanking Mr. Rutstein for his dedicated service to our community and the Authority.

Captain Ryan has been a member of the Salem Police Department since 2003, rising from the rank of patrol officer to sergeant in 2009 and from sergeant to captain in 2014. As Captain, one of his responsibilities has been coordination with the Salem Harbormaster around the City's federal Port Security grants, including submissions, reporting, and oversight. Prior to joining the police department Captain Ryan was the chief engineer for Keystone Shipping for 13 years, supervising a variety of aspects of the shipyard and vessel operations. Captain Ryan holds a Bachelor's degree in marine engineering from the Massachusetts Maritime Academy and a Master's degree in criminal justice from Western New England University.

I strongly recommend confirmation of Captain Ryan's appointment to the Harbor Port Authority. We are fortunate that he is willing to serve our community in this important role and lend his expertise and dedication to the Authority and the important work it has underway.
