

Innovation project areas & resources provided to support the work of Innovators

- Project-based learning
 - Reading core text
 - Hired facilitator who has expertise in both PBL and teaching ELLs
- Creating opportunities for student voice and choice
 - Several members attended Facing History & Ourselves workshops/ seminars
- Integration of technology within learning experiences
 - Purchased laptop cart for team to share
 - Secure licenses for apps to experiment with
 - Facilitated by district Director of Digital Learning
- Stipend provided to all teachers

Goals of College & Career Center

- Increase the amount and focus of time spent between students and counselors
- Ensure that all students develop a 4-year plan that is grounded in student interests and charts a course toward attaining future college & career goals
- Every senior applies to college
- Every senior applies for financial aid
- Provide opportunity for early college experiences
- Enhance supports for and out-reach to first generation college bound students

Year One

 Students take university level English and History co-taught by SSU professors and SHS teachers at SHS

Year Two


- Students chose one of two pathways Healthcare or Business: Information Technology
- Students take two classes in their pathway taught by SSU professors at SSU

Up to 50 SHS Students per Cohort


- Participating students reflect the SHS demographic

- Students finish the Early College program with four university level classes

- Internship experiences play a critical role in both
- Internships are an opportunity for all students instead of a reward for some
- A Salem Public School's Internship is a thoughtful partnership experience

Early Win Spotlight 4: Internships

Assessed, evaluated, and identified opportunities

- Forged strong student relationships
- Consulted with faculty and community partners
- Examined current system to identify opportunities
- Assembled and analyzed data
- Collaborated with other local high schools
- Outreached to local businesses and organizations

Early Win Spotlight 4: Internships

Next Year's Outlook

- Currently, a limited number of students go out on internships at SHS
 - CTE Early Education program-19
 - 5 new external internship placements
- In 2018/2019 we anticipate 50-60 students will participate in a structured community-based internship
- Supported by the Internship Coordinator, additional staff
- 77 rising Juniors have been identified for spring next year
