The City of Salem is participating in two programs to increase the number of trees planted on private property:

The Greening of the Gateway Cities Program, part of the MA Urban Canopy Project, and The Century Tree Program,
Salem's 400th anniversary project.

Greening of the Gateway Cities is a state program open only to residents in a designated Planting Zone.

-- Note that Ward 6 or Ward 1, Precinct 1 are **not** included in the Planting Zone --

If your property is in the Planting Zone, make an appointment with the Forester from the Department of Conservation and Recreation.

Dozens of tree species are available. The Forester will help you select a beautiful tree and plant it for you.

All you have to do is water the tree for two years.
