A painted crosswalk is a showing of solidarity, but we know that the work before us is to ensure these are more than symbols; they must be values in practice.

City of Salem Prepares for Storm Impacts

The City of Salem encourages all community members to monitor weather forecasts and City alerts ahead of the potential storm, likely to arrive this coming weekend, overnight September 15th through September 16th.

The National Weather Service has issued a tropical storm watch for Coastal Massachusetts, including Salem, for Friday night through Saturday. Salem will be in the outer wind band fields of the storm and may see gusts in the 40-50 MPH range. There may be a tidal inundation up to 3' with a minor storm surge, all dependent on the timing of the storm at high tide.

Residents who live in areas prone to coastal flooding should plan ahead; anticipate road closures on streets prone to flooding. Currently there is no recommendation from the Salem Fire Department/Emergency Management to evacuate.

Rainfall amounts may exceed 2" so residents weekend during the predicted storm," said are asked to help ensure storm drains and catch basins in the vicinity of their home are clear. Stay tuned to local media and social media for any further updates.

The City of Salem is taking the following actions to prepare for the storm:

Closing or opening tide gates for the South River and Forest River as necessary to help mitigate flooding in the South Salem area;

Installing jersey barriers in the Juniper Point and Shore Avenue areas to provide additional sea wall and storm surge protection;

Checking and cleaning catch basins in as many locations as feasible to help mitigate flooding (residents are encouraged to assist by checking catch basins and storm drains near their homes);

Staging barriers in targeted locations for anticipated road closures in flooding-prone areas;



Pre-emptively scheduling crews for the highest forecasted rain times to assist with potential flooding issues;

Pre-emptively scheduling standby tree crews for the highest forecasted wind times during the storm;

Installing generator at the Ocean Avenue pump station in the event of a power loss to the station.

"Please take precautions and stay alert this Mayor Dominick Pangallo. "Be sure to check on any neighbors who may need assistance, and reach out to the City with any emergency needs."

The City of Salem Department of Public Service (DPS) will be on call for any other utility issues that may arise. In case of such an issue, call DPS at 978-744-3302 during normal business hours (Monday-Friday, 8AM-4PM). Outside of normal business hours call the Salem Police at 978-744-1212 or Salem Fire at 978-744-1235.

For issues that arise overnight on Friday or over the weekend, residents should call the Salem Police Department 978-744-1212. Do not use SeeClickFix or the DPS business line in those situations.

To report a power outage, call 1-800-465-1212. To report an emergency, call 9-1-1.

"Too many useful items end up in our landfills," said Mayor Pangallo. "The SalemRecycles Book Swap is an opportunity for us to interrupt that cycle and to pass along many perfectly good items to others in the community to enjoy."

Charlotte Forten Memorial Artist Presentations & Community Feedback Session



The City of Salem and the Charlotte Forten Memorial Project Advisors have invited four talented artists as semi-finalists to create original design proposals for a life-size bronze sculpture in the likeness of Charlotte Forten Grimké. Guided by community input gathered at every phase of the process over the last five years, from naming the park to what shape the memorial should take, the winning design will be commissioned as a memorial to celebrate and elevate Charlotte Forten Grimké's life and legacy, as well as her time spent in Salem. The finished work will be installed in Charlotte Forten Park in downtown Salem at 289 Derby Street.

Community members are invited to attend a public event featuring a meet and greet with the Salem Public Art Commission and live presentations from all four semi-finalist artists, followed by a community feedback session and Q&A with the semi-finalist artists.

The Artist Presentations & Community Feedback Session will be a hybrid event hosted at the North Shore Community Development Corporations' Espacio (105 Congress Street, Salem) and on Zoom (<u>https://mapc.ma/3qKWbVO</u>). The event is scheduled for Tuesday, September 19, 2023 from 5:30pm – 7:30pm.

The Artist Semi-Finalists for Phase 1 of the Charlotte Forten Memorial Project are David Alan and MJ Clark, D.A. Clark Sculpture LLC; Ai Qiu Hopen, Humanity Memorial; Ann Hirsch, Ann Hirsch Sculpture Studio LLC; and Steven Whyte.

The in-person portion of the event is free and open to the public. Those who wish to attend inperson should register at this link: <u>https://charlottefortenmemorialsalemma.eventbrite.com</u>. Registration for the in-person event is requested due to limited capacity, though is not required to attend. Interpretations will be available both in-person and virtually including Spanish, American Sign Language (ASL), and Communication Access Realtime Translation (CART) Service. Community members should reach out with other accommodation inquiries.

After this hybrid public event, community members will be invited to vote on their favorite memorial concepts. Voting will take place September 20th through October 9th 2023. While Salem's City Hall is physically located at 93 Washington Street, many community members have never stepped foot inside the building. With 'City Hall to Go', residents throughout the city have access to a wide variety of services and can connect with employees from many City departments, right in their neighborhoods.

'City Hall to Go' has already popped up at the Community Life Center during Heritage Days and Palmer Cove Park during the Back to School Fair. 'City Hall to Go' will be showing up to offer city services everywhere from neighborhood block parties to wellness fairs at the Community Life Center, from the Farmer's Market to community events at Espacio, and from Salem State University to



Salem school activities. The schedule varies every month and is shaped, in part, by interest and requests directly from Salem residents themselves.

Not only are the locations varied, but every version of 'City Hall to Go' is different, because it is tailored to the neighborhood and event. For example, family friendly events might give kids at the event the opportunity to be able to get library cards and check out books. Attendees can learn about and apply for job openings with the City of Salem, or apply for a volunteer role on one of the City's many Boards and Commissions. At some 'City Hall to Go' pop-ups, participants can pay city bills, apply for permits or licenses, or register to vote. The 'City Hall to Go' team especially enjoys bringing along family friendly activities for kids to enjoy while residents access city services!

'City Hall to Go' services are available in English and in Spanish.

Race Equity Commission Introduces Discrimination Reporting Form, Available in Multiple Languages



The City of Salem's Race Equity Commission released a new Discrimination Derection different catego at: <u>https://records.salem.com/Forms/DRF</u>. The form aims to canture come The form aims to capture comprehensive data on discriminatory incidents data on discriminatory incidents experienced by community members, including bias, racist actions, and microaggressions.

While similar tools exist in other municipali-

ties, Salem stands out by offering its Discrimination Reporting Form in multiple languages: Spanish, Portuguese, French, and Haitian Creole. These languages were selected based on the City of Salem's Census data and feedback from the Salem Public Schools.

Entries can be completed and submitted anonymously and most data fields are optional. The form is intended to equip City officials with a better understanding of community experiences, aiding in even more effective resource allocation for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) initiatives.

"Everyone should feel safe and welcome in the City of Salem," said Mayor Dominick Pangallo, "Discrimination in all forms is challenging to address, but it's our goal and our responsibility as a City to work toward eliminating it. This new Discrimination Reporting Form is one more tool to help us learn more about what our residents, workers, and visitors are facing in our community. We can use their feedback and the data from the form to improve our approaches to ensuring a more welcoming community for all."

Regina Zaragoza Frey, the City of Salem's DEI Director, remarks, "Originating from Salem's Human Rights Coalition (previously 'No Place for Hate'), this form now stands as a testament to the collaborative efforts of the Race Equity Commission in understanding and addressing discrimination in our community. Thank you to the Commission members who have engaged in intentional dialogue about the creation of this form."

Alphonse Wright, Chair of the Salem Human Rights Coalition and Vice Chair of the Race Equity Commission, adds, "The in-person reporting of discrimination can be daunting or even embarrassing. Our digital and anonymous form seeks to alleviate these barriers, striving for ease of use and accessibility. While it may not eradicate discrimination, shining a light on these issues is a pivotal step towards its elimination."

Those submitting reports through the form should be aware that such reports are considered public records and therefore enter information accordingly. The data will not be used to prompt a response to a particular individual event and anyone experiencing an incident that may necessitate a law enforcement response should report the incident to the Salem Police Department.
