PLANNED STREET CLOSURES – SATURDAY, OCTOBER 28; SUNDAY, OCTOBER 29 & TUESDAY, OCTOBER 31



On Saturday, October 28 and Sunday, October 29, the Salem Police Department will be closing most downtown streets beginning at 11:00 a.m., and on Tuesday, October 31, downtown streets will be closed by 2:00 p.m., though some may close earlier if there is a public safety need. Traffic moving in and out of Salem is expected to be extremely heavy October 28-31.

These multiple road closures include: Essex Street from North Street to Union Street, Washington Street from New Derby Street to Bridge Street, Federal Street from Washington Street to North Street (and a small portion of Federal Street at the Washington Street end), a portion of Church Street, a portion of Lynde Street, Washington

Square North and West from Essex Street to Williams Street, a portion of Washington Square South, Hawthorne Boulevard, Derby Street from Lafayette to Congress Street, Route 1A, Charter Street, Central Street, Front Street, and Lafayette Street from New Derby Street to Front Street.

*Please also be aware that crowd size could also require the Police Department to shutdown other streets not listed above, as well as street closures on Monday, October 30th.

Franklin Street and Bridge Street at Sgt. James Ayube Memorial Drive will also close to all traffic between the westerly overpass ramps and Sgt. James Ayube Memorial Drive from 9:30pm to 10:30pm for the closing fireworks to be held at 10:00 p.m. on October 31st.

NO PARKING AREAS

The following are posted Tow Zones from 7:00 a.m. to Midnight, Saturday, October 28, Sunday, October 29 & Tuesday, October 31:

- Lafayette Street both sides from Derby Street to Front Street.
- Public parking lot along Front Street. Public parking spaces located on Central St in front of old police station. Meter spaces Central/Front/Charter.
- Essex Street from North Street to Union Street. Both sides.
- Derby St both sides between Union Street and Lafayette St.
- Hawthorne Blvd both sides.
- Front Street.
- · Central Street.
- · Church Street.

- Washington Street from New Derby to Bridge Street both sides.
- Washington Sq. South, and West both sides, and a portion of Washington Square North.
- Norman Street from Washington Street to Crombie Street.
- New Derby St between Klop Alley and Lafayette Street.
- Margin Street in front of Post office, Taxis only.
- Federal Street both sides from St. Peter's
 Street to the former Superior Court.



Electric Vehicle Charging Fee

As of October 20th, the City of the Salem will be charging a \$0.35/kWh fee for charging at all publicly accessible electric vehicle (EV) charging stations. Though it will not cover the full cost of City ownership and maintenance of these stations, this fee will help offset some of these costs while ensuring that the City of Salem can continue to provide and expand this service in the future. City of Salem Introduces Lockbox Registration Program for Salem Adults 60 Years of Age or Older



The population of the City of Salem is approximately 44,000. Close to 20% are 60 years of age or older. If you are 60 or over, have you thought of what will happen if you have an emergency when alone?

Mayor Dominick Pangallo and the Salem Police Department (SPD), in collaboration with Salem for All Ages, are initiating a safety net for such situations. Any Salem community member aged 60 or older may voluntarily register their code-operated lock box containing a key to their house, condo, or apartment with the Salem Police Department. This is a free service designed for peace of mind for individuals, family members, and friends.

Having a lock box registered with the SPD will allow emergency responders to access the home more quickly in the event of an emergency and will also prevent unnecessary damage to the residence. Lock boxes can be purchased online or at a local hardware store. Salem Affordable Housing Trust Fund Board's Construction Grant Program Leverages \$500,000 in ARPA Funds to Support Affordable Housing

This week, Mayor Dominick Pangallo announced that the City has launched a new funding application, administered through the City's Affordable Housing Trust Fund Board ("Trust"), to help produce and retain affordable housing units in Salem. The Trust's Request for Development Applications utilizes funds from the City's American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) allocation to run a competitive construction grant program, offering support to shovel-ready projects that most advance the City's housing priorities as outlined in the Housing Roadmap.



"One of the leading challenges facing Salem and our entire Commonwealth right now is the need for affordable housing," said Mayor Pangallo, "This new grant program is one more important step toward addressing this complex need. I am grateful to the dedicated volunteers on the Affordable Housing Trust Fund Board and the City staff who have developed this new initiative and to our federal partners whose support for ARPA funding has made it possible."

Housing costs in Salem are significantly outpacing incomes. Around 48% of Salem residents are low to moderate income, and 42% of those residents spend more than half of their takehome income on housing costs, leaving little income for other necessities, such as food, clothing, transportation, and medical costs. This grant program seeks to assist in the creation and preservation of affordable housing units in the City, which will assist in meeting this urgent need.

This is a construction grant program, administered on a reimbursement basis. Applications can be for new construction and rehabilitation projects. The maximum grant award is \$500,000 and partial grants may be awarded. Eligible projects a) must serve qualifying households and populations, as described by U.S. Treasury's Final Rule, b) advance the goals of the Housing Roadmap, with points allocated in accordance with the Scoring Rubric approved by the Trust, c) have land use approvals in hand, meaning permitting is complete, and d) be able to commit the funds for direct hard costs no later than June 30, 2024.

The City of Salem is now accepting applications from eligible applicants. Deadlines for applications is end of day (12pm EST) on **Friday, December 15, 2023**.
